DEER CROSSING SEASON

Tips to keep you safe and your family safe during deer season:

Read how a Nationwide customer stayed in his lane and avoided disaster. Tips provided by Nationwide and Insurance Information Institute



Pay attention,

from sunset to midnight and during the hours shortly before and after sunrise. That's when most deer-vehicle collisions happen.



The herd is the word.

If you see one deer, others may be nearby. Just because you missed one doesn't mean you can let down your guard.



Mind the signs!

You've probably seen those "Deer crossing" signs while driving. That means the area is known to have a large deer population.

Be ready to react in these areas.



Turn on your bright lights!

Use high beam headlights if driving at night when there is no oncoming traffic. The higher light will allow you to see a deer's eyes on or near the roadway.



Make some noise!

If you see a deer, blow your horn with one long blast to frighten it away.



Always wear your seat belt.

Most people injured in car-deer crashes were not wearing their seat belt.



Remain calm, brake firmly, and stay in your lane.

Many serious crashes occur when drivers swerve to avoid a deer and hit another vehicle or lose control of their cars.



34% vs 32% – Base:


Load: 20% - No Change





2024 vs 2023


Base: 41% vs 44%
