- Requires assessment of environmental effects of proposed actions
- Requires analysis before decisions are made and before actions are taken
- Includes public outreach and analysis availability
- "Action-forcing"
- It is the law

# Land, Property, Facility Sales, and Acquisition





### Federal Proposed Action - Interconnections

- BPA interconnection facilities such as:
  - Taps, switches, substations, access roads
- Land use requests for BPA fee-owned property
- Line reliability actions such as impairments



## Federal Proposed Action Example Interconnection Project

### 20-MW Solar Development

- Solar panels
- Collector lines
- Collector substation
- Access roads
- ~300 acres of disturbance

### BPA Proposed Action

- Tap
  - New switches
  - New structures
  - Relocation structures
  - Access road extension
  - ROW easement
- New radio tower
- Substation electronic equipment
- ~0.2 acre disturbance;
   0.8 acre of new easement

### NEPA Implementation Steps

- Environmental Analysis
  - Integrates review of other applicable environmental laws
- Consultation and Permitting
  - Land Managers and Regulatory Agencies
  - Tribes
- Public Involvement
- Documentation
- Implementation of Mitigation Measures/BMPs

### **Environmental Analysis**

- Review of maps, aerial photos, existing data
- On-the-ground field surveys
- Modeling
- Consultation with Tribes and other agencies with expertise
- Development of project specific maps
- Identification and implementation of mitigation measures



- Categorical Exclusion (CX)
- Environmental Assessment (EA)
- Environmental Impact Statement (EIS)





### **BPA Compliance and Design Process**

FES and ISIS Studies

- Environmental lead internal request by transmission
- NEPA and permitting strategies developed

ESA (if needed)

- Environmental Compliance and NEPA funding
- Funding of BPA design to support NEPA analysis

FAS Study (60% to 90% Design)

- Scope and extent of Federal action determined
- Environmental field work and analysis
- Design modifications
- Draft and finalize NEPA documents

100% Design

- NEPA complete
- Mitigation action plan complete
