Dear Ms. Brannon:

I am the Oregon attorney for Dan and Carole Parker, former owners of real property located approximately four miles north of Washougal, Washington, abutting North Bonneville-Troutdale Lines 1 & 2 at mile post 17. A landslide occurred in this area December 1999 as a result of another adjacent property owner's improper construction of an access road.

BPA engaged Landslide Technology to perform an evaluation of the slide and, subsequent thereto, BPA performed substantial work in mid- and late calendar year 2000 to repair/buttress the land in that area as its interest in protecting major power transmission lines was endangered. According to the Parkers, BPA personnel informed them that the slide area was, as a result of BPA's efforts, as stable or better than before the attempted and improper construction of an access road by the neighbor to the North, a Mr. Hight.

The Parkers are now engaged in a lawsuit in which BPA's efforts to address the slide must be detailed. On behalf of the Parkers, I herewith request the following:


- General project description of the landslide repair project, including dates of initiation and completion of the project(s), evaluation and final assessment or BPA efforts to accomplish its objectives and goals regarding the slide area
- Name and contact information for the project manager/supervisor of the BPA repair effort;
- Description of specific tasks performed by BPA and the objective of those tasks relative to repairing/buttressing/stabilizing the slide area

Please be advised that BPA is not a party to this lawsuit as it is between two private parties. The requested information, however, is essential, I believe, to the resolution of the matter. The

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Parkers are willing to pay reasonable fees for the requested information up to \$100.00. If you estimate fees to exceed this amount, please provide me with the estimated amount. The requested information may be provided for physical pick-up as my office is here in Portland, or via regular mail.
