**Re: Oregon Public Records Act and Freedom of Information Act Request**

Dear Ms. Munro:

We represent the Vancouver, WA-based not-for-profit organization Citizens against the Towers (the "Citizens") with respect to this request. We and the Citizens greatly appreciate BPA's recent refinements to the I-5 Corridor Reinforcement Project, and we continue to strongly encourage BPA to identify and implement a path forward that maximizes routing through private and public timbers lands and eliminates or minimizes impact to populated areas in Southwest Washington.

To assist our client and the general public in fully understanding the substance, viability and magnitude of consideration given to newly proposed route segments farther to the east and the north (as described in BPA's August 2, 2010 Memo to Parties Interested in the I-5 Corridor Reinforcement Project (the "Project")), pursuant to the Freedom of Information Act and the Oregon Public Records Act, we hereby request copies of all communications in any way related to the Project between the BPA and: (a) the Washington Department of Natural Resources; (b) the Washington Department of Fish and Wildlife; (c) Weyerhaeuser and its affiliated companies; (d) Longview Timber Corporation and its affiliated companies; and (e) Sierra Pacific Holdings Company and its affiliated companies. Such communications may be limited to the period January 1, 2009 through the date of this letter and shall include all documents relating to internal or external communications on the Project, whether created by, received by or used to communicate or record communications between, within or among any of the parties listed

above and includes, but is not limited to, all email, correspondence, letters, notes, facsimiles, messages and memoranda.

I would appreciate the requested information within 14 days in electronic format. As our client is a non-profit and non-commercial organization and our representation of them is being done on a pro bono basis, we hereby request a waiver of all fees for this request. Disclosure of the requested information is in the public interest because it is likely to contribute significantly to the public understanding of the Project and the viability, cost and credibility of the refinements summarized in BPA's August 2, 2010 Project memorandum. If this waiver request is denied, we are willing to pay fees for this request up to \$250.
