PORTLAND, Ore. The works of over a dozen artists are on display at the American Indian Fine Arts Festival now underway at the Federal Complex East, 905 NE 11th Ave. (BPA headquarters). This is one of a number of scheduled events celebrating National Native American Heritage month.

The American Indian Fine Arts Festival will be on display throughout November in the lobby of the Federal Complex East, located one block south of the Lloyd Center, from 8 a.m. to 5 p.m., Monday through Friday.

The festival and other events, which are open to the public, provide opportunities for American Indian art investors and enthusiasts alike.

The events are being sponsored by the American Indian/Alaskan Native Council, a Bonneville Power Administration employee resource group. The Bureau of Indian Affairs, U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service, and the National Marine Fisheries Service also are participating.

The events reflect the tradition, diversity and culture that are still practiced today among Native Americans and Alaskan Natives. The theme of the month-long observance is "Mother earth . . . one people."
