



## **BPA awards community education grants**

**COEUR d'ALENE, Idaho. - The Idaho Department of Water Resources received a \$2,500 grant today from the Bonneville Power Administration for it's 1997 Idaho Water Awareness Week.**

The grant is one of 13 such grants given throughout the Northwest as part of BPA's Education Program. The grants will support projects that teach environmental awareness and energy efficiency to elementary, middle and high school students.

"Northwest educators are seeing tighter budgets," said Joan McNamara, BPA's education coordinator. "Organizations like BPA should help find creative ways to supplement the shrinking education dollar. As an organization committed to supporting education in the Northwest, BPA is proud to award this grant to 1997 Idaho Water Awareness Week."

The Water Awareness Week grant will help Idaho sixth graders learn about water and the environment. Students will spend five days in the classroom studying conservation, pollution prevention and the many demands put on our water resources. In addition to class room study, the students will have opportunities to participate in field trips, study the science of water, and discover the role water has played in Idaho's history, culture and economy.

"Water Awareness Week has been a great opportunity to develop mutually beneficial partnerships between business and schools to educate Idaho's children," said Rob Swedo a BPA official in Spokane. "We are excited to give this grant. Also, as a part of Water Awareness Week, we are proud to announce that we are extending our hands on education program "Kids in the Creek" to schools in the Lewiston and Sandpoint areas." BPA has been a sponsor of Water Awareness Week since its inception in 1994.

This year, in addition to sponsorship, BPA is awarding the grant to help provide Water Awareness Week kits to the 10,000-12,000 students who will participate in the week-long program in school districts all over Idaho between April 28 and May 2, 1997.
