Who: 76 teams (each with four players and one alternate) of high school students from Oregon and Washington and more than 100 volunteers.

What: Competition of wits in math and science; a &“Jeopardy!®”-like bowl with bells and buzzers for those who know the answers to questions like:

“What is the range, in parts per million (ppm), that the concentration of carbon dioxide exists in the atmosphere?”

When: Saturday, March 8, 1997, starting at 8:30 a.m. The final rounds will begin around 3:30 p.m. The championship round will be held around 5 p.m.

Why: The competition is designed to ignite excitement and show support for students in math, science and technology — especially women and minorities, who are underrepresented in these fields. Like athletes, science bowl students deserve fans and thrive on competition.

The winning High School Science Bowl team will take an all-expenses-paid trip to Washington, D.C., in May to compete in the Department of Energy-sponsored National Science Bowl®.
