What: Liberty, Brewster and Oroville school students will receive surplus computers from the Bonneville Power Administration, the Pacific Northwest's federal power marketing agency.

Who: Garry Thompson, BPA account executive, and Mike Storms, BPA engineer, will deliver the computers to the schools this week.

These officials as well as Roger Meader of Okanogan County Electric and Harlan Warner of Okanogan PUD and principals from the schools will be available to answer questions and give comments at the events.

Why: As a federal agency, BPA is implementing [Executive Order 12999, Educational Technology: Ensuring Opportunity for All Children in the Next Century](#). The order allows agencies to transfer computers and related peripheral tools (e.g. printers, monitors, etc.) surplus to the needs of the agencies to schools and nonprofit educational organizations. BPA purchased its computers with revenue generated from sales to its electric utility customers.
