Portland, Ore.— The Bonneville Power Administration named Greg Delwiche as vice president of Generation Supply. Delwiche is responsible for managing the supply of power from the Columbia River Basin's hydroelectric dams owned by the [U.S. Army Corps of Engineers](#) and the [U.S. Bureau of Reclamation](#), and other resources.
