RAVENSDALE, Wash. — The Bonneville Power Administration is offering up to \$1,000 for information leading to the arrest and conviction of individuals who fired into BPA's control house at the Raver Substation (located in south central King County, Washington, near the town of Ravendale) sometime between the evening of Dec. 15 and the morning of Dec. 18. Fortunately no personnel were inside the substation at the time of the shootings. Property damage consisted of broken glass.

The King County Sheriffs Department and the Federal Bureau of Investigation are involved in the investigation. The shots were fired through the front door, as well as windows facing the road.

"BPA is extremely concerned about the safety and welfare of our employees. We are relieved that no one was in the building at the time of the shootings," reported Michael Berg, security specialist for BPA. "The perpetrators of this shooting need to be caught."
