 - Purchasing/Selling Entity
 - Load Serving Entity
 - Customer Aggregator
 - Distribution Provider
 - Load (end-use customer)
 - Other
- How does eligibility change under retail access?


Requirements for customers and providers

- Contractual Relationship with RTO West
 - Transmission Contract Holder
 - Transmission Control Agreement
 - Generation Interconnection Agreement
 - Load Interconnection Agreement
 - Other
- Technical
 - Quantity/Capacity
 - Response time (if applicable)
 - Location (if applicable)
 - Metering and telecommunications
 - Certification
 - Other

Approach

- Identify Ancillary Services
- Determine requirements
- Build a matrix of the ancillary services showing which of the entities is required or eligible to buy and who is eligible to provide.
