Dear Sir,

This is a request for information under the Freedom of Information Act.

I am a member of the local non-profit mutual benefit corporation 'Save Our Rural Oregon'. This information is not for commercial use and is requested in order to gather information about the electric power industry as it is structured in the Klamath Basin of Southern Oregon.

I request information pertaining to the purchase of power by Bonneville from either Pacific Klamath Energy Inc. or Pacific Power Marketing Inc. during the 2003 calendar year. This power would be only that power produced at the Klamath Cogeneration facility located near Klamath Falls, Oregon. We would like to know if Bonneville purchased any power from the above named facility during the last calendar year, the amount that was purchased and what price was paid for this power. We also need to know if any part of the power purchased was made under the 'Residential Exchange' program.

If during the year quantity or price changed significantly, we request that the information be collected as monthly amount totals (Megawatt hours) and monthly average purchase price (dollars per Megawatt). A significant change would be a change of more than 100 average Megawatts per week or a change of more than \$10.00 per megawatt-hour. We are not interested in day-ahead or hour-ahead amounts or rates.

I request a waiver of all fees for this request. Disclosure of the requested information to me is in the public interest because it is likely to contribute significantly to public understanding of the operations or activities of the government and is not primarily in my commercial interest. Our group, Save Our Rural Oregon, is trying to assemble an accurate picture of the power market in the Klamath Basin (and the COB trading point) in order to make knowledgeable recommendations to local and state officials on the direction of rural Klamath County. If a fee can not be waived we are willing to pay fees for this request up to a maximum of \$250. If you estimate the fees will exceed that amount, please contact me first. Thank you.
