

1 QUALIFICATION STATEMENT OF

2 TIMOTHY D. MCCOY

3 Witness for the Bonneville Power Administration

4 *Q. Please state your name, employer, and business address.*

5 A. My name is Timothy D. McCoy. I am employed by the Bonneville Power Administration
6 (BPA), 905 NE. 11th Avenue, Portland, Oregon.

7 *Q. In what capacity are you employed?*

8 A. I am a Computer Specialist (Systems Analyst) in the Power Products, Pricing and Rates
9 group for the Power Business Line.

10 *Q. Please state your educational background.*

11 A. I have done undergraduate work in accounting, mathematics, and computer science at
12 Oregon State University and Portland State University.

13 *Q. Please summarize your professional experience.*

14 A. For approximately eight years, starting in 1971, I was the head of Equitable Savings and
15 Load Association' technical support department responsible for maintaining the operating
16 systems and online systems of Equitable's mainframe computers, and for planning and
17 maintaining Equitable's multi-state computer network.

18 In 1979, I joined Washington Mutual Savings Bank. After helping convert their
19 operating systems and online system to newer more state-of-the-art IBM systems, I became
20 the manager of maintenance and development for all of Washington Mutual's deposit
21 systems as well as their ACH system and cash machine network.

22 In 1990, I returned to Oregon, and joined UNISYS as a contractor for BPA.
23 My assignment was to develop methods to improve the efficiency of the programs running
24 on BPA's IBM mainframe computers. I also assumed management responsibilities for a
25 development support group, and later I assumed responsibility for the completion of a
26 wholesale power and transmission billing system for BPA.

1 For the 1996 rate case, I participated in the Lloyd Center negotiations as a
2 representative of billing. My responsibilities included assuring that the results of the
3 Lloyd Center process could be automated, suggesting alternatives what would better lend
4 themselves to automation, and later to work with a team of computer specialists to upgrade
5 the billing system to meet the requirements of the 1996 rates and contracts.

6 *Q. Please state your experience as a witness in previous proceedings.*
