### WHO MAY APPLY:

All current GS-9 to GS-13, BL-00, and BS-00 career and career-conditional employees of the Bonneville Power Administration are encouraged to apply.

To remain eligible, interested candidates must remain at GS-9 or higher grade level or BL-00 and BS-00 (permanent or temporary) throughout the application and program period (August 5-8, 2024.)

This is a leadership developmental opportunity under the Chief Culture Office's Diversity, Equity, Inclusion and Accessibility program.

Participation in the Federally Employed Women (FEW) 2024 National Training Program does not result in a promotion.

### **GENERAL INFORMATION:**

The FEW National Training Program is designed for all occupations at various levels of service, and each training session is mapped to the Office of Personnel Management's (OPM) Senior Executive Service, Executive Core Qualifications (Leading Change, Leading People, Results Driven, Business Acumen and Building Coalitions) and the underlying fundamental core competencies. This year's conference theme is "Unleashing Your Full Potential: Learn, Recall, Apply, Reinforce."

The Chief Culture Officer will select up to three candidates. BPA's selection is anticipated in June 2024.
