To: Parties interested in the Walla Walla Basin Spring Chinook Hatchery Program

The Bonneville Power Administration (BPA) has completed the draft environmental impact statement (EIS) for the Walla Walla Basin Spring Chinook Hatchery Program. This letter requests your comments on the EIS and invites you to public meetings.

BPA is proposing to fund the Confederated Tribes of the Umatilla Indian Reservation's (CTUIR) proposal to construct and operate a hatchery at an existing fish facility managed by the CTUIR on the South Fork Walla Walla River near Milton-Freewater in Umatilla County, Oregon.

BPA is considering two alternatives for construction of the hatchery, as well as the No Action Alternative. Under Alternative 1, the CTUIR would build a new hatchery to incubate and rear 500,000 spring Chinook smolts for release in the Walla Walla River basin to augment populations available for harvest and help establish a naturally spawning population in the Walla Walla basin. Under Alternative 2, the hatchery would rear the same fish as Alternative 1 but would also accommodate the rearing of 810,000 spring Chinook smolts for an ongoing Umatilla basin program. This alternative would transfer production of Umatilla spring Chinook from the existing Umatilla Hatchery near Irrigon, Oregon to the proposed new Walla Walla Hatchery to help alleviate water constraints at Umatilla Hatchery.

Draft EIS

The draft EIS describes the alternatives, discusses anticipated impacts to natural and human resources, and identifies mitigation measures that would help avoid or minimize impacts.

We invite your comments on the draft EIS. If you requested a copy of the document, it is enclosed.
