BPA's Evaluation team is conducting in-depth research into residential centrally ducted variable speed heat pumps (VSHP) and air source heat pumps (ASHP) by analyzing Advanced Metering Infrastructure (AMI) data, to better understand savings and real-world usage.

BPA and Evergreen Economics will discuss the study and describe how utilities can participate in this research effort (and even benefit from it)! This webinar will go over the upcoming data request for customers' AMI data and contact information for an end-user survey.
