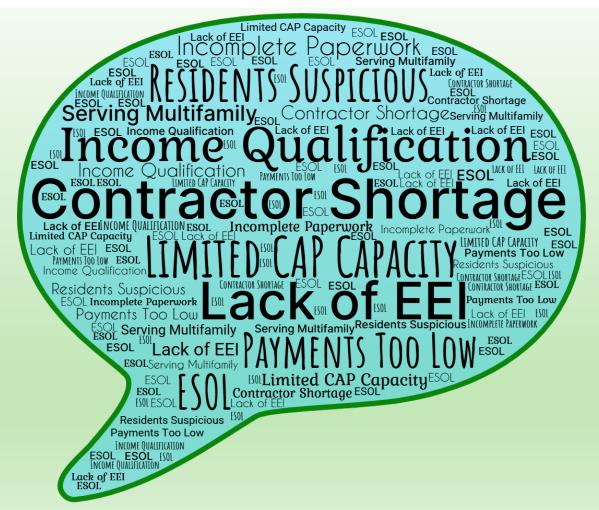

Looking Ahead

- Exploring new approaches to support CAP and utility collaboration or utility inhouse implementation
- ► Increased coordination between BPA funding sources, including LIEE state and tribal grants, to cover LIEE projects
- Increased collaboration with regional CAP networks
- ► Increased coordination with community non-profits
- Collaboration with engineering on pilot programming

Looking Ahead

- ► Increased facilitation of utility and tribal collaboration on energy efficiency projects
- Increased frequency of review average market costs and payment cost caps

- Exploring barriers to reporting LIEE savings when the work is already completed

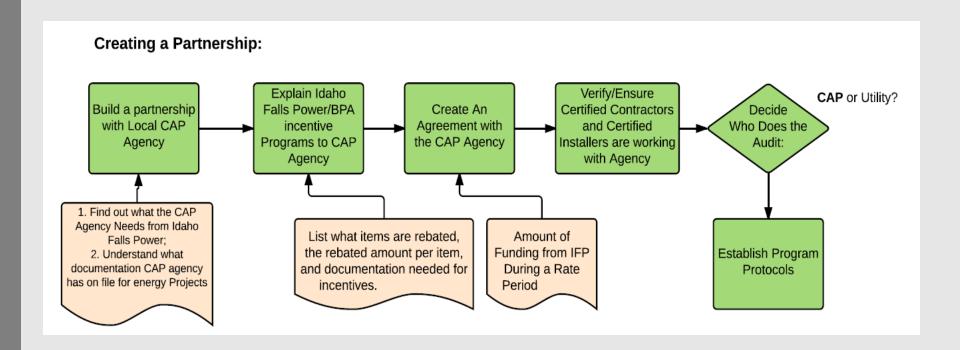


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Idaho Falls Power Low Income Program

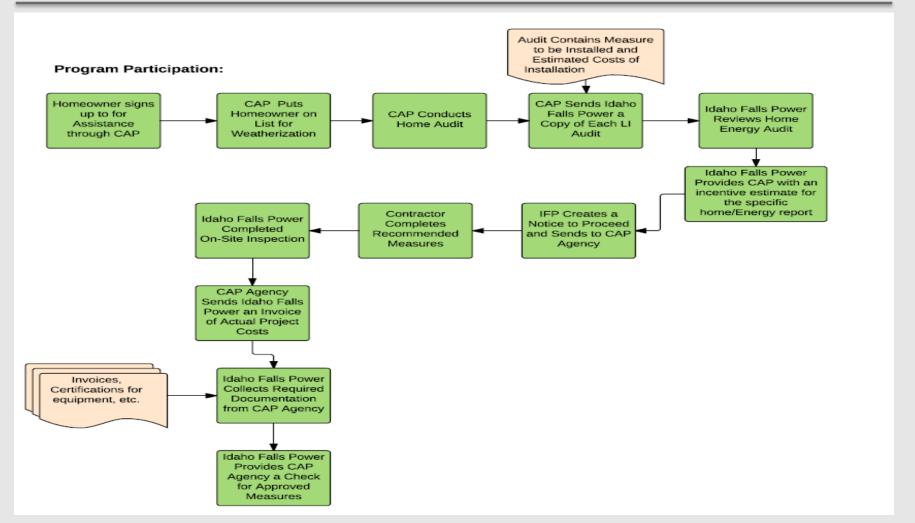


Idaho Falls Power Low Income Processes
