Proposed Action: Indreland Road Easement Acquisition

<u>Categorical Exclusion Applied (from Subpart D, 10 C.F.R. Part 1021):</u> B1.24 Property Transfers

<u>Description of the Proposed Action:</u> Bonneville Power Administration (BPA) proposes to purchase an easement along approximately the easternmost 2.5 miles of Indreland Road from Missoula County and other underlying private landowners. BPA would use Indreland Road to access its Hot Springs-Rattlesnake #1 230kV transmission line for ongoing maintenance and line upgrades. BPA will conduct separate environmental analysis for any proposed construction or work on the access road if the actions are proposed.

<u>Findings:</u> In accordance with Section 1021.410(b) of the Department of Energy's (DOE) National Environmental Policy Act (NEPA) Regulations (57 FR 15144, Apr. 24, 1992, as amended at 61 FR 36221-36243, Jul. 9, 1996; 61 FR 64608, Dec. 6, 1996; 76 FR 63764, Nov. 14, 2011; 89 FR 34074, April 30, 2024), BPA has determined that the proposed action:

- 1) fits within a class of actions listed in Appendix B of 10 CFR 1021, Subpart D (see attached Environmental Checklist);
- 2) does not present any extraordinary circumstances that may affect the significance of the environmental effects of the proposal; and
- 3) has not been segmented to meet the definition of a categorical exclusion.

Based on these determinations, BPA finds that the proposed action is categorically excluded from further NEPA review. ¹

Project Site Description

Indreland Road is located in unincorporated Missoula County, Montana and runs approximately 3.5 miles between State Highway 93 on the west end and BPA's Hot Springs-Rattlesnake No. 1 230kV transmission line right of way on the east end. Forestry and agriculture are the predominant land uses with some residences adjacent to the road mostly on the western end. Indreland road follows a small valley running east to west, with small drainages interspersed throughout. Vegetation is a mix of valley bottom crops, shrub-steppe and coniferous forest.
