Dear Mr. Fleming,

This communication is the Bonneville Power Administration's (BPA) final response to your request for agency records made under the Freedom of Information Act, 5 U.S.C. § 552 (FOIA). Your records request was received on October 24, 2018 and was formally acknowledged on November 2, 2018.

## Request

"...documents related to the construction of the tower on property 54532 SR2 Sultan, WA 98294 Parcel #27103400400100....[the] construction happened after September 11, 2001, [seeking] beginning and ending construction dates as boundary fence gate and access driveway were destroyed [and] seeking permit obtained to construct the tower on a flood plain."

### Response in Part

BPA conducted a search for responsive information in the Transmission Engineering Office. Responsive information was gathered in regards to the construction dates you seek. The BPA FOIA Office released the construction dates information of September 16, 2007, thru October 15, 2007, via an email to you on November 7, 2018.

### Withdrawal in Part

Thereafter, you indicated in your November 7, 2018, reply email to the FOIA Office that you are withdrawing those portions of your request for the permit and environmental reports. This communication serves as notice that your partial request for reports and permits is now administratively closed. No further action will be taken in response to your request for the reports and the permit. As a reminder, if you do still seek those permit and environmental report records you may, of course, submit a new FOIA request for them.

#### Fee

There are no FOIA fees applicable to the fulfillment of your request for BPA records.

#### Certification

Pursuant to 10 C.F.R. § 1004.7(b)(2), I am the individual responsible for the records release and determinations described above. Your FOIA request BPA-2019-00098-F is now closed, in part, with all available agency records provided, and administratively closed, in part, following your stated request for withdrawal.

## Appeal

The adequacy of the search may be appealed within 90 calendar days from your receipt of this letter pursuant to 10 C.F.R. § 1004.8. Appeals should be addressed to:

The written appeal, including the envelope, must clearly indicate that a FOIA appeal is being made. You may also submit your appeal by e-mail to OHA.filings@hq.doe.gov, including the phrase "Freedom of Information Appeal" in the subject line. (The Office of Hearings and Appeals prefers to receive appeals by email.) The appeal must contain all the elements required by 10 C.F.R. § 1004.8, including a copy of the determination letter. Thereafter, judicial review will be available to you in the Federal District Court either (1) in the district where you reside, (2) where you have your principal place of business, (3) where DOE's records are situated, or (4) in the District of Columbia.
