Thank you for your interest in the Bonneville Power Administration (BPA). We have received your request for records under the Freedom of Information Act (5 U.S.C. § 552). Request

"To comply with Western Electricity Coordinating Council standards, BPA proposes to manage vegetation with the goal of removing tall-growing vegetation that is currently or will soon become a hazard to the transmission line (a hazard is defined as one or more branches, tops, and/or whole trees that could fall or grow into the minimum safety zone of the transmission line(s) causing an electrical arc, relay and/or outage)."

My request is for 1) The Western Electricity Council Standards mentioned herein [and] 2) BPA's definition of the "minimum safety zone" of a transmission line."

 Western Electricity Coordinating Council (WECC) Standards – Section 215 of the Federal Power Act requires the Electric Reliability Organization (ERO) to develop mandatory and enforceable reliability standards in the United States. In 2006, the Federal Energy Regulatory Commission granted ERO designation to the National Electric Reliability Council (NERC). WECC is responsible for compliance monitoring and enforcement of NERC standards. The standard you seek is a NERC facilities design, connections, and maintenance (FAC) standard, *FAC-003-4*, *Transmission Vegetation Management*, and is available at the following link:

Thereafter, judicial review will be available to you in the Federal District Court either (1) in the district where you reside, (2) where you have your principal place of business, (3) where DOE's records are situated, or (4) in the District of Columbia.
