Dear Mr. Missel,

This communication concerns your request for Bonneville Power Administration (BPA) records made under the Freedom of Information Act, 5 U.S.C. § 552 (FOIA). BPA received your records request on November 18, 2019 and formally acknowledged your request on December 16, 2019. A partial release of records was sent to you on October 13, 2020.

### Request

"...the records described below pertaining to the Bonneville Power Administration's ("BPA") communications with its customers:

- 1. Any and all communications received by BPA from any of its wholesale customers or sent from BPA to any of its wholesale customers since January 1, 2018 that refer or relate to development of, consideration of, agreements to enter into, or negotiations about new long-term power contracts.
- 2. Any and all records that document, memorialize, or refer to any meetings, conversations, or other communications between BPA and its wholesale customers regarding development of, consideration of, agreements to enter into, or negotiations about new long-term power contracts."

On January 3, 2020, BPA sent you a letter which proposed a clarification of scope. The agency explained that knowledgeable agency personnel would, "interpret this [request] to mean any communications related to negotiation of successor agreements to BPA's current Regional Dialogue Power Sales Contracts (i.e., Load Following, Slice/Block, and Block), effective from October 1, 2011, to September 30, 2028."

### Clarification

On January 7, 2020, you replied:

"The proposed clarification/restatement appears to capture the first part of the original request. The proposed clarification/restatement is therefore acceptable as a clarification of the first part of the request, provided that BPA understands and agrees to the following:

- if there are any wholesale power customers whose contract start and end dates are different from October 1, 2011 and September 30, 2028, communications with those customers are responsive to the request;
- the term "successor agreement" should be broadly construed in favor of disclosure—if a communication relates to the negotiation or discussion of a power purchase agreement or contract that would replace, extend, or modify a current agreement or contract, that communication is responsive to the request; and
- the clarification applies only to the first part of the request—the second part of the request remains in force."

### **Second Partial and Final Response**

BPA has searched for and gathered records responsive to your request. In an effort to both accommodate the review of the large volume of responsive records, and to provide the records expediently within the limitations of available agency resources, BPA is releasing responsive records to you in installments, as permitted by the FOIA. A second and final release of responsive records accompanies this communication.

The second partial and final response comprises 437 pages with the following redactions:

- Two pages with redaction made under 5 U.S.C. § 552(b)(2) (Exemption 2)
- 38 pages with redactions made under 5 U.S.C. § 552(b)(5) (Exemption 5)
- 37 full pages redacted under 5 U.S.C. § 552(b)(4) (Exemption 4)
- 52 pages with redactions made under Exemption 4
- 64 pages with redactions made under 5 U.S.C. § 552(6) (Exemption 6)

### **Explanation of Exemptions**

The FOIA generally requires the release of all agency records upon request. However, the FOIA permits or requires withholding certain limited information that falls under one or more of nine statutory exemptions (5 U.S.C. §§ 552(b)(1-9)).

### Exemption 2

Exemption 2 permits withholding of agency information "related solely to the internal personnel rules and practices of an agency." BPA invokes Exemption 2 to protect internal internet portals and telephone call-in passwords.

### Exemption 4

Exemption 4 permits withholding third party confidential commercial information found in agency records. BPA here relies on Exemption 4 to protect commercial and financial information belonging to the agency's wholesale customers.

### Exemption 5

The FOIA's Exemption 5 deliberative process privilege protects records showing the deliberative or decision-making processes of government agencies. Records protected under Exemption 5 must be both pre-decisional and deliberative. A record is pre-decisional if it is generated before the adoption of an agency policy. A record is deliberative if it reflects the give-and-take of the consultative process, either by assessing the merits of a particular viewpoint, or by articulating the process used by the agency to formulate a decision. BPA has considered and declined a discretionarily release of some pre-decisional and deliberative information in the responsive records set because BPA can reasonably foresee that disclosure would harm the interests intended to be protected and encouraged by Exemption 5. BPA invokes Exemption 5 to protect discussions related to development of the post-2028 preference power sale contract.

### Exemption 6

Exemption 6 protects information in "personnel and medical files and similar files" when the disclosure of such information "would constitute a clearly unwarranted invasion of personal privacy" (5 U.S.C. § 552(b)(6)), and if there is no public interest that outweighs the privacy interest. BPA relies on Exemption 6 in this instance to withhold cellphone numbers and personal information not related to agency business. BPA can find no public interest in the release of this information as it does not shed light on the mission or working of BPA, as an agency.

### Certification

Pursuant to 10 C.F.R. § 1004.7(b)(2), I am the individual responsible for the search and response detailed above. Your FOIA request BPA-2020-00227-F is now closed with all available responsive agency information provided.

### **Appeal**

The adequacy of the search may be appealed within 90 calendar days from your receipt of this letter pursuant to 10 C.F.R. § 1004.8. Appeals should be addressed to:

Director, Office of Hearings and Appeals HG-1, L'Enfant Plaza U.S. Department of Energy 1000 Independence Avenue, S.W. Washington, D.C. 20585-1615

The written appeal, including the envelope, must clearly indicate that a FOIA appeal is being made. You may also submit your appeal by e-mail to <a href="OHA.filings@hq.doe.gov">OHA.filings@hq.doe.gov</a>, including the phrase "Freedom of Information Appeal" in the subject line. (The Office of Hearings and Appeals prefers to receive appeals by email.) The appeal must contain all the elements required by 10 C.F.R. § 1004.8, including a copy of the determination letter. Thereafter, judicial review will be available to you in the Federal District Court either (1) in the district where you reside,

(2) where you have your principal place of business, (3) where DOE's records are situated, or (4) in the District of Columbia.

I think last year was a refueling year, so that's relevant. \$36 is non-refueling average I'm told. More generally - hard to compare a firm resource to market. We don't do a good job of valuing resource adequacy in the northwest, but very few (maybe zero?) large load serving entities are comfortable/allowed to rely on market for large portions of their load service obligations. For the IOUs, PUC make sure that there's firm resources assuring reliability.

On the \$61 thing, you mentioned that on the phone the other day too, but could you confirm my recollection? I recall you saying at recent PPC meeting, BPA folks were presenting on the Capital program for Fed Hydro, and in that presentation we stated that we make an assumption of \$61 market power. Is that right?

Page 35 of the Strat Plan has a graph that shows a significant divergence from Market to PF.

PF has something like 1100 MWs embedded at a cost of \$50+ per MWh. (CGS)

PF is adding COE & BOR Capital projects at a **planned** cost of \$61 per MWh. (\$300,000,000 per year).

BPA wants to be the supplier of choice for post 2028 contracts?

Does anyone own a 4 function calculator at BPA? It's time somebody "solved for X".

How much would PF reduce without CGS in the mix. Seriously? Wouldn't the PF drop to around 28 bucks without CGS?

Let's see, page 13 of Strat Plan says CGS is 22% of BPA's "program costs".

Page 37 says "\$22.5m equals about a 1% rate increase.

This is the kind of discussions I thought the region would have with Focus 2028, which kind of morphed into a strategic plan without any plans.

At some point, we need to start having these difficult discussion. I would suggest sooner would be better.

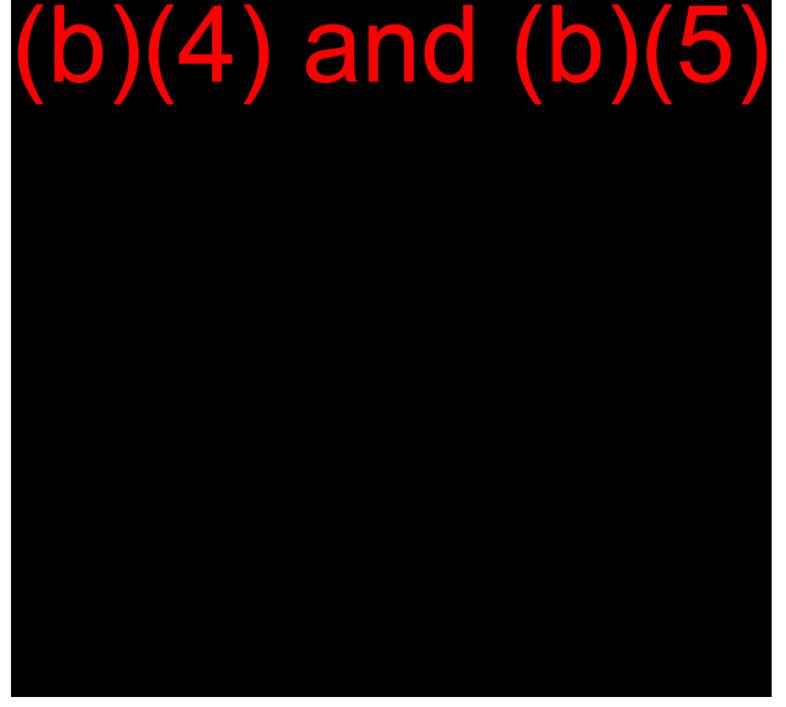

Hi Scott,

Some tactical thoughts and some higher level ones. On the tactical front:

- 1. Maybe you could put a sentence in at the beginning that makes it clear that you are submitting this letter in response to the request for comments in the reserves process. Sometimes letters to the administrator spin up a response effort, and I don't think you're looking for a letter back on this. Redline suggestion attached.
- 2. You use the first person a fair bit. It would be stronger I think if you said EPUD. E.G. in the third paragraph "In EPUD's opinion..." instead of "In my opinion...".
- 3. You only speak to the reserves policy, and we have the leverage policy out as well. Some of what you say generally relates to both. Might add a paragraph stating EPUD's thoughts on the leverage policy, even if just to say "makes sense since largely Transmission". I'm guessing there.

### On the higher level front:

- 1. Your suggestion that "One of the ways to give customers more confidence in BPA's cost future is to show in the very next rate case that it is under control. Another way is to include a rate goal in the Financial Reserves Policy" would be awkward in my opinion. The topics of rates and reserves are marginally related, but fairly different. I might instead suggest something generic like "EPUD suggests that BPA adopt a policy for rate goals, either using this process on reserves and leverage or as a stand-alone topic".
- 2. On that same suggestion, setting it up as an either or proposition doesn't sing for me. Couldn't we do both? I like your thought on rates being important, perhaps most important, but that seems like an additive concern. In other words rating agencies want long term contracts AND reserves.

### Dear Elliot,

Thank you for the customer outreach <u>and opportunity to comment</u> on <del>your</del> <u>BPA's</u> Financial Reserves Policy. We appreciate the opportunity to discuss and weigh-in on this very important issue to BPA, its customers, and the region. <u>Please find my/EPUD's comments below.</u>

The presentation packet, provided by BPA at the kick-off meeting on March 2, 2018, included selected quotes from the three credit rating agencies. While we fully appreciate the perspective provided by these quotes, we believe the remainder of the reports are equally, if not more important to note. As I have previously stated, while Bonneville's leverage is important, in the long-term it is imperative that post-2028 customer contracts are signed to secure a continued low credit rating. As we march closer and closer to customers making decisions, this issue will weigh even more heavily on the credit rating agencies' view of BPA.

In my opinion, we have two rate cases until this issue starts getting <u>beyond</u> us. Below is what the three agencies say about long-term contracts in their recent reviews of BPA's credit rating:

### Moody's

Bonneville Power Administration's (BPA) credit profile reflects its credit strengths comprising of .... Long-term power contracts ..."

### Fitch

"If new contracts are not signed beyond 2028, revenues available to service Bonneville's debt obligations would be reduced. Bonneville's ability to offer a competitively priced power supply will be a key factor during the extension of power sales contracts."

### S & P

"If, during our two-year outlook horizon, BPA does not shore up its competitiveness, liquidity, and revenue stream, including surplus sales revenues, we could lower the stand-alone credit profile."

In my opinion, the credit rating agencies are going to be much more concerned about the possibility of NOT having customers locked up into long-term contracts for credit rating purposes than the leverage issue. To that end, I would suggest that BPA has two more rate cases to get customers more comfortable that costs can be held in-line with other supply options, and to ensure that BPA is the place to continue providing power to serve most (or all) of a public power utility's needs.

Two rate cases.

One of the ways to give customers more confidence in BPA's cost future, is to show in the very next rate case that it is under control. Another way is to include a rate goal in the Financial Reserves Policy. There should be a firm commitment to customers that their competitiveness concerns are going to be met. I would further suggest the leverage target be a "shock absorber" for the rate goal.

BPA needs financial stability, and so do its customers. As customers, we need to be able to plan our own long-term finances. BPA power costs can make up to 50% of a utilities' cost structure. The current process is one of holding our breath every two years and hoping that BPA's rate increase will fit into our financial stability plans. This makes it hard for us to plan when we get a roughly 60-day notice every two years of what will happen to our cost structure.

This may drive some of your customer's decisions for power supply.

In short, financial stability needs to work for BPA and for its customers. In addition, it all needs to get us to post-2028 contract signatures. The three credit rating agencies are going to be watching this very closely. So are BPA's customers.

Two rate cases.

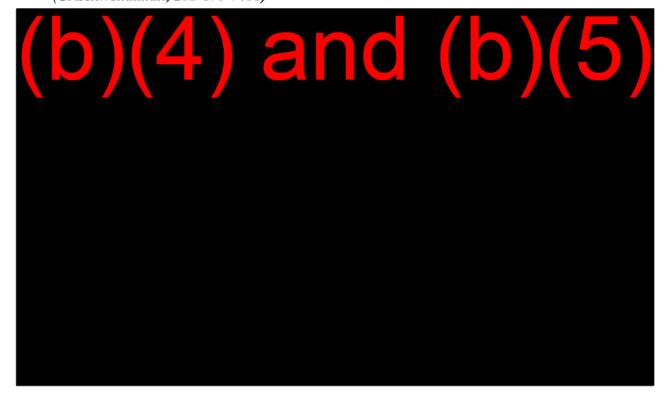

### **Energy Efficiency Mini Roundtable (Albion, Idaho)**

Pontip Kruse (did an amazing job!) organized a mini roundtable to help clear up confusion about recent changes in the IDEA group. The IDEA group uses services from both Efficiency Services Group (ESG) and UAMPS (formerly United and Idaho Falls). Customers also experienced Customer Portal EEI invoicing issues with these changes. BPA staff also presented on the programs and services including distribution system improvements and voltage optimization (Tony Koch), Ag and engineering services (Dick Stroh and Larry King), and a session to help with conservation contracts and oversight (Charlie Webber).

After the meeting, we received a number of compliments from customers about the usefulness and relevancy of topics presented, noting that it wasn't lost on them that we brought our experts out to the tiny city of Albion to meet with a group of our smaller customers on topics meaningful to them. One customer shared that this was the "Best BPA Meeting Ever" and the meeting was "meaningful and made customers feel valued". (C. Schwendiman, 208-670-7406)



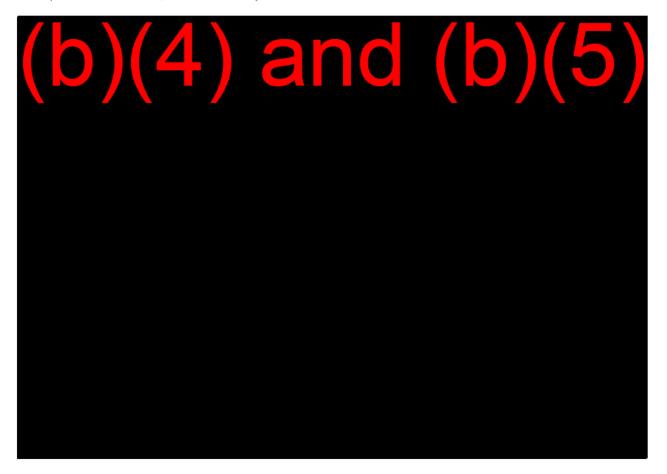

I wanted to give you a quick briefing on my discussion with Scott Corwin today. Scott had reached out to me and wanted to discuss Post 2028 and a current survey PPC is conducting with their members. Scott remembered seeing the Draft Issues paper I had about a year ago and was curious if we had assigned any dates to start working on specific issues. He also discussed at a high level the survey they currently are conducting that ends this month.

I shared with the current work being done now on Post 2028 issues is having staff, that have worked on these issues in the past, (I used Residential Exchange as an example), develop educational information that we would need to better understand the issue, how we got where we are today, and what opportunities we would have Post 2028 versus how we administer them today. I also used the Functionalization of costs between Power and Transmission as an issue we can discuss internally and if possible pursue alternatives sooner than Post 2028 that would not require RD contract modifications. He mentioned he was aware that a sub-set of customers had approached us on our level of interest in discussing new Power Contracts that would replace their existing RD Contracts. He saw a paper the group circulated indicating the biggest hurdle would be to get the rest of Public Power on board. Scott said he is thinking about getting a group of customers together, not sure which ones, to start discussing Federal power issues like;

- Is the current allocation of the Federal system what you want to see in new contracts with BPA?
- Residential Exchange
- Is there interest in proposing legislation to change portions of the Act? He asked me if I was aware of any discussion along these lines and I told that the initiative to move something forward would have to come from Public Power working with their elected officials.
- Length of contracts was another topic and not all having the same length.

Scott commented that if BPA becomes uncompetitive, (PPC does not want that), but if it happened, he's not sure the role PPC would play in the Region. Today their overall mission is based on BPA and one main supplier of power to the Publics. He doesn't want to see Public Power become further divided Post 2028. The sense I got from Scott, although he did not exactly say this, is part of him wanting to have Federal Power discussions with a group of customers is to see where the dividing factors are and work on bridging those issues to keep Public Power together.

He will set up a meeting with me once the PPC survey results are in to further discuss the customer group discussion idea, Federal power issues and Post 2028.

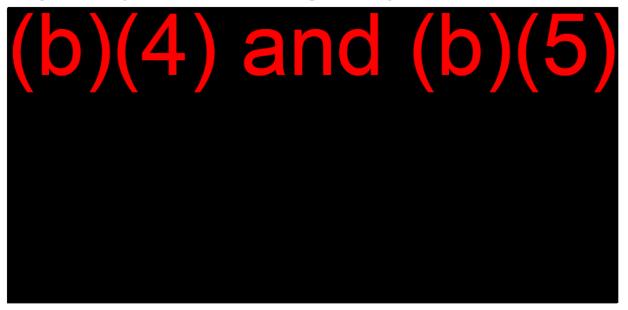
### **Coos-Curry Electric Cooperative**

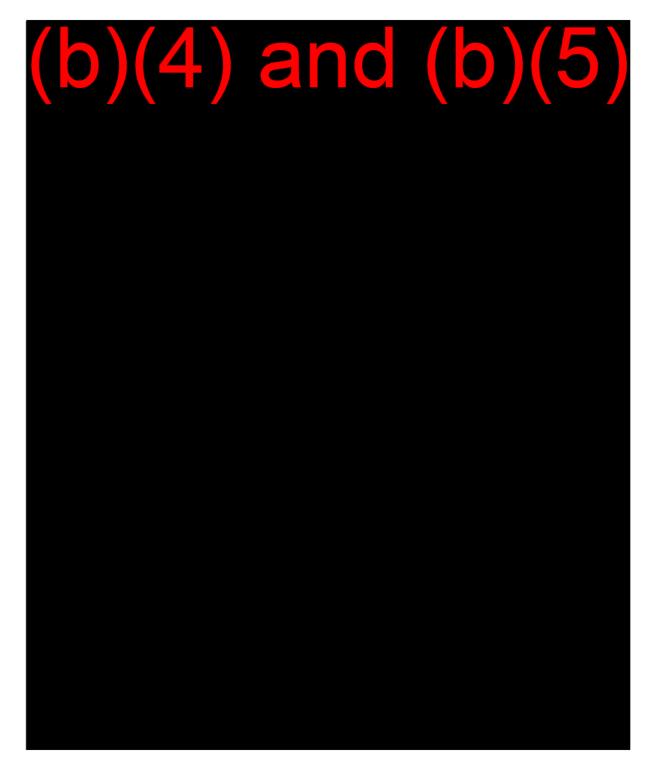

Primary topics covered included BPA competiveness and Oregon's potential carbon Cap and Trade legislation. Regarding BPA

PLEASE DO NOT DISTRIBUTE 4 of 5 competiveness, the overall mood was fairly discouraging. Many of the speakers conveyed a sense that while BPA is doing the right things with the Strategic Plan, etc., we may not be able to address the fundamental competitiveness challenges alone. Instead, legislative help may be necessary. Furthermore such legislative action may only be possible if we experience a "crisis" that sparks action on the part of congressional law-makers. Elliot did a fantastic job closing out the meeting and talked about BPA's strategic plan and the important progress being made to deliver on its goals. He also cautioned that talk of a crisis is counterproductive in that it may play into the hands of the dam breach community. Instead, maintaining a sense of urgency around the execution of our Strategic Plan is most important at this point. Regarding the Cap and Trade topic, most of the utilities remain skeptical on its benefits and have concerns about the loss of local control and the potential for harm being caused to local businesses.

### Port of Seattle - Sea-Tac Airport

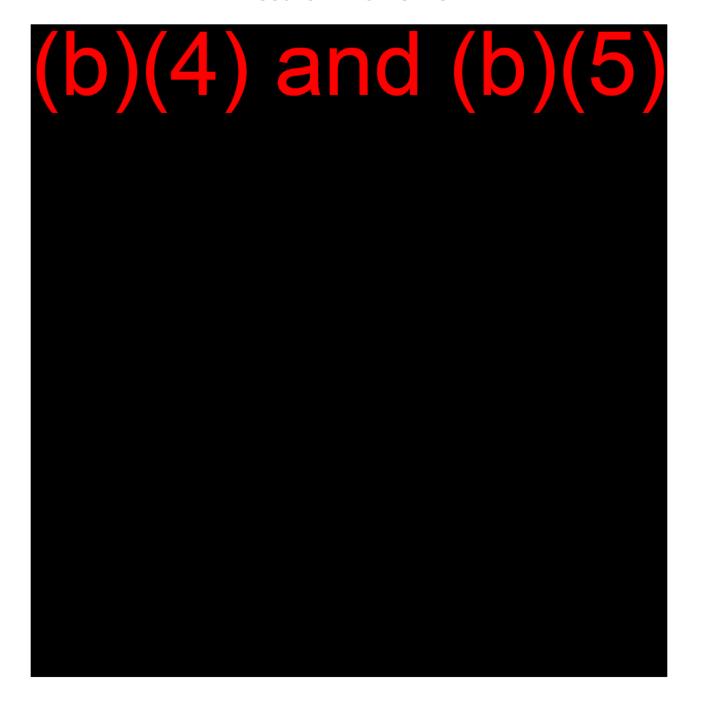

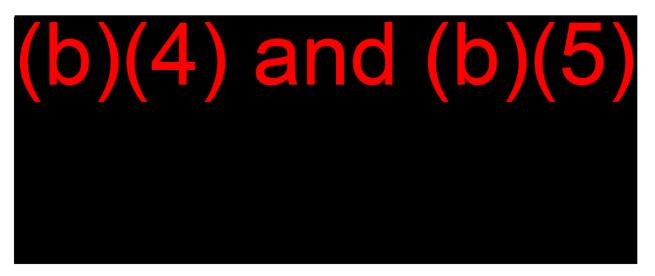

I just realized you also asked about the recently issued transfer service "guidelines".

These guidelines are specific to <u>new</u> points of delivery. The guidelines clarify existing policy to say that we will consider a set of specific guidelines or criteria when determining whether BPA will assume the financial responsibility for serving new PODs. I think about it as we will only pay for new transfer PODs if there's not a feasible or cost-effective direct connect opportunity (e.g. too far away from existing BPA lines), and assuming it's a critical new POD (not just a "nice to have" to allow for things like speculative load growth).

### Financial Reserves Business Unit (BU) Misallocation

- Corrects errors in the allocation of cash between Power and Transmission through BPA's internal cash split model, the BU Cash Split Model
- The errors in the BU Cash Split Model, which date back to 2003, understated Power's share of cash and overstated Transmission's share of cash in the Bonneville Fund
- Total cash in the Bonneville Fund was unaffected
- Review process, which began in 2018, included:
  - a detailed analysis of the BU Cash Split Model
  - three public workshops, followed by comment periods
  - BPA published its proposed corrective actions July 2019
- The ROD, issued on October 22, 2019, contains BPA's final resolution of the BU Cash Split errors. To resolve the errors, BPA will allocate \$182.3 million (\$158.7 million in principal and \$23.6 million in interest) to Power from Transmission

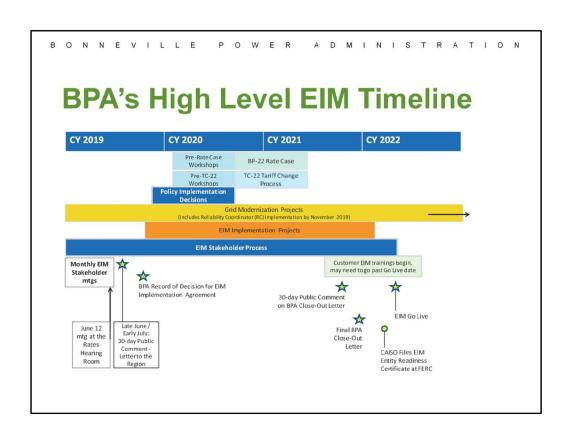

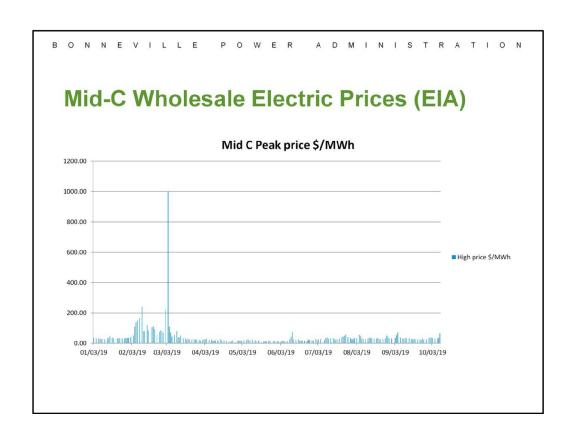

### **GLOSSARY OF TERMS**

"Contract Resource" – any source or amount of electric power acquired from an identified or unidentified electricity-producing unit or units by contract purchase, and for which the amount received does not depend on the actual production from an identified generating resource.

"Dedicated Resource" – a Specified Resource or an Unspecified Resource Amount (listed in Exhibit A) that was obligated by contract or statute to serve customer's Total Retail Load prior to October 1, 2006.

**"Existing Resource"** - a Specified Resource (listed in Exhibit A, section 2) obligated by contract or statute to use to serve customer's Total Retail Load prior to October 1, 2006.

"Generating Resource" – a source or amount of electric power from an identified electricity-producing unit for which the power received is determined by the power produced from such unit. Such unit may be owned by customer or its retail customer, in whole or in part, or output from such unit, all or any part thereof, owned for a defined contract period.

"New Resource" -- a (1) Specified Resource, listed in Exhibit A section 2, that was or is obligated by statute or contract to serve customers Total Retail Load after September 30, 2006, or (2) any Unspecified Resource Amount.

"Specified Resource" – a Generating Resource or Contract Resource that has a nameplate capability or maximum hourly purchase amount greater than 200 kilowatts, that customer is required by statute or agreed to serve its Total Retail Load. Each resource is identified in Exhibit A, sections 2 and 4 (for NLSL).

"Unspecified Resource Amount" – an amount of firm energy, listed in Exhibit A, sections 3 and 4, that customer has agreed to supply and use to serve it Total Retail Load. Such an amount is not attributed to a Specified Resource.

**"Federal Columbia River Power System (FCRPS)"** - The hydroelectric multipurpose facilities constructed and operated by the U.S. Army Corps of Engineers and the Bureau of Reclamation in the Pacific Northwest and the transmission system constructed and operated by BPA used to market and deliver electric power whose costs are funded and repaid through BPA power and transmission rates.

As mentioned yesterday, the goal is to have the final questionnaire questions to AEs by the end of next week. Additionally, we'll have a tool for the AEs consisting of the questionnaire *supplemented* with "AE notes" that give context/background/statutory references to help you prepare for the conversations.

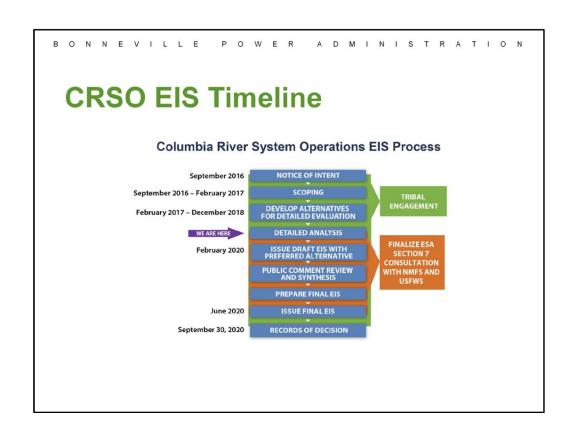
# Financial Reserves Business Unit (BU) Misallocation

- Corrects errors in the allocation of cash between Power and Transmission through BPA's internal cash split model, the BU Cash Split Model
- The errors in the BU Cash Split Model, which date back to 2003, understated Power's share of cash and overstated Transmission's share of cash in the Bonneville Fund
- Total cash in the Bonneville Fund was unaffected
- Review process, which began in 2018, included:
  - a detailed analysis of the BU Cash Split Model
  - three public workshops, followed by comment periods
  - BPA published its proposed corrective actions July 2019
- The ROD, issued on October 22, 2019, contains BPA's final resolution of the BU Cash Split errors. To resolve the errors, BPA will allocate \$182.3 million (\$158.7 million in principal and \$23.6 million in interest) to Power from Transmission

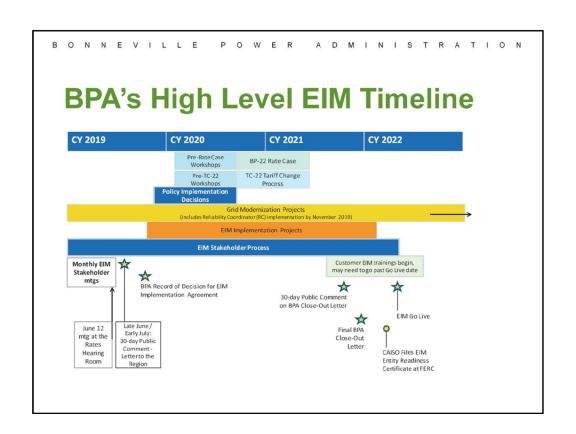

I have not received the link mentioned in your email below. Nonetheless, I wanted to let you know that PNGC is not responding to the survey. PNGC members will make their own decisions to respond individually or not.

I thought I'd take a brief moment to explain our thinking behind this decision because we don't want to convey that our non-response means we don't care or that this is not important. My view is that these issues are critically important

and we care deeply. As your email indicates, we are early in policy development and in a time of profound change. In fact, our regional electric world and market has changed remarkably since the current contracts were entered in to over 10 years ago.

Personally, I think we need to start with an open dialogue process. BPA sort of started this with the Focus 2028 process (i.e. discussion about products and services, etc.) and then the effort went dormant while BPA developed and started implementation of its strategic plan. We think it makes sense to restart this effort, but I question whether a survey as structured is the right vehicle and whether the specific questions will lead to the answers we need. Some of the questions strike me like this:

1. Please rank-order your most important body parts: (a) brain, (b) lungs, (c) heart, (d) left arm, (e) right arm, (f) other? (comment box)

While such a question might generate a lot of data I am not sure what information it is going to generate. I'd advocate that we resume a dialogue process that starts higher level and works toward the specific. Obviously, when we get to execution of post-2028 contracts things will be very specific. The lawyers will make sure of this I am sure. It seems to me that we need to think about the process and schedule we are working on as well. BPA has been foundational to the region's power and transmission service for decades. In fact it was 4 score and 3 years ago that BPA was created. How BPA serves power and transmission to our region is a big question. I think we can draw on lessons of past and current contracts for what has worked well and for what has worked not so well.

However, we cannot simply think about the past and current contracts. What we may need going forward may be something entirely different. Looking to the past and current contracts is important, but we should not be bound by those constraints. We should ask ourselves questions like: "what if our fundamental assumptions about the future turn out to be 100% wrong?" For example, much of the TRM's foundation was based on a premise that we needed to fairly allocate a scare resource (federal power) that was substantially below market. The wind and solar revolution has turned things our world on its head. DSIs which used to be a central feature of our region and foundational to how we paid for policies like the ResEx are gone. We used to live in a world where our primary concern was lack of energy in dry years and capacity was plentiful. Now we live in a world of energy gluts much of the time and capacity being increasingly precious. We've seen dramatic changes to the federal hydro system caused by increased costs and lost production often driven by environmental requirements. If anything, these requirements just seem to increase and cause more uncertainty.

PNGC and its members have valued BPA for decades and it is highly likely that BPA value will continue in some form after 2028. Obviously, we need specific products and services with specific terms and conditions at some point well ahead of 2028. I think we should think about a logical process and schedule to get us from where we are now to such a point. This is going to require a lot of work and I certainty think we need to get going. PNGC's decision to not respond to the survey is not a refusal to communicate or a signal that we don't sense time being important. We absolutely want to engage with BPA about the future.

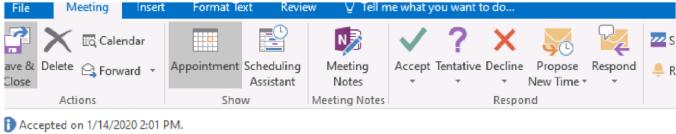




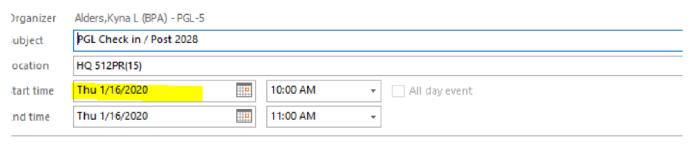

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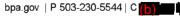

I have not received the link mentioned in your email below. Nonetheless, I wanted to let you know that PNGC is not responding to the survey. PNGC members will make their own decisions to respond individually or not.

I thought I'd take a brief moment to explain our thinking behind this decision because we don't want to convey that our non-response means we don't care or that this is not important. My view is that these issues are critically important and we care deeply. As your email indicates, we are early in policy development and in a time of profound change. In fact, our regional electric world and market has changed remarkably since the current contracts were entered in to over 10 years ago.

Personally, I think we need to start with an open dialogue process. BPA sort of started this with the Focus 2028 process (i.e. discussion about products and services, etc.) and then the effort went dormant while BPA developed and started implementation of its strategic plan. We think it makes sense to restart this effort, but I question whether a survey as structured is the right vehicle and whether the specific questions will lead to the answers we need. Some of the questions strike me like this:

1. 1. Please rank-order your most important body parts: (a) brain, (b) lungs, (c) heart, (d) left arm, (e) right arm, (f) other? (comment box)

While such a question might generate a lot of data I am not sure what information it is going to generate. I'd advocate that we resume a dialogue process that starts higher level and works toward the specific. Obviously, when we get to execution of post-2028 contracts things will be very specific. The lawyers will make sure of this I am sure. It seems to me that we need to think about the process and schedule we are working on as well. BPA has been foundational to the region's power and transmission service for decades. In fact it was 4 score and 3 years ago that BPA was created. How BPA serves power and transmission to our region is a big question. I think we can draw on lessons of past and current contracts for what has worked well and for what has worked not so well.

However, we cannot simply think about the past and current contracts. What we may need going forward may be something entirely different. Looking to the past and current contracts is important, but we should not be bound by those constraints. We should ask ourselves questions like: "what if our fundamental assumptions about the future turn out to be 100% wrong?" For example, much of the TRM's foundation was based on a premise that we needed to fairly allocate a scare resource (federal power) that was substantially below market. The wind and solar revolution has turned things our world on its head. DSIs which used to be a central feature of our region and foundational to how we paid for policies like the ResEx are gone. We used to live in a world where our primary concern was lack of energy in dry years and capacity was plentiful. Now we live in a world of energy gluts much of the time and capacity being increasingly precious. We've seen dramatic changes to the federal hydro system caused by increased costs and lost production often driven by environmental requirements. If anything, these requirements just seem to increase and cause more uncertainty.

PNGC and its members have valued BPA for decades and it is highly likely that BPA value will continue in some form after 2028. Obviously, we need specific products and services with specific terms and conditions at some point well ahead of 2028. I think we should think about a logical process and schedule to get us from where we are now to such a point. This is going to require a lot of work and I certainty think we need to get going. PNGC's decision to not respond to the survey is not a refusal to communicate or a signal that we don't sense time being important. We absolutely want to engage with BPA about the future.

## **II. Operations Updates**

- BON flow being managed to chum minimum by passing inflow at GCL.
- Expecting cold snap next week. The cold weather coupled with dry conditions to-date could cause evaluation of GCL minimums to hedge for dry conditions. In response to customer questions, BPA does not anticipate shifting Flow Aug storage out of January (See email from Ted on Jan 9, 10:27 AM).
- Some currently scheduled outages will be moved out of next week due to cold and dry forecast.
- Arrow discharges moving from 47 kcfs to 57 kcfs next week.
- Drum gate work is likely at GCL. Drum gate work will be confirmed around February 5<sup>th</sup>.

## **III. Slice Contract Executive Overview Planning**

- BPA and customers discussed draft presentation materials and identified modifications for both BPA and customers to change in their respective slides.
- Brainstorming discussions of "opportunities for improvement" will not be part of executive level briefing, but rather be discussed at the operational level at a later date.

## IV. EIM Phase III Q&A

- BPA will be focusing on Resource Sufficiency and Cost Allocation between February and June 2020.
- SIG discussed questions provided by customers in December. See Attachment 2 for the Q&A.
   BPA noted instances where customer ideas are welcomed to help BPA understand what would work for customers with respect to timing of decisions and identification of any operational constraints that are critical for solutions to consider.
- BPA encouraged customers to attend the January 15<sup>th</sup> customer led workshop.
- The SIG acknowledged that detailed considerations like timing of Slice decisions would be best discussed in the SIG as they are contract-specific.
- It was noted that as existing Power Purchase Agreements expire, the market dynamics will change with respect to who participates and with which resources.
- BPA hopes that CAISO will make a change on how Variable Energy Resources are addressed.
- Customers noted that treatment of transmission losses has a direct nexus with the Slice contract
  and that the discussion of this topic during Phase III will be important. BPA acknowledged their
  recognition of the issue.

## V. Miscellaneous

- EDAM Engagement: BPA noted that this will be discussed at PPC on January 29<sup>th</sup>.
- Post-2028 product surveys: BPA expects to provide customers with survey information on January 13<sup>th</sup>. Responses will be due in March. These surveys are separate from the prior general customer surveys circulated in 2019. As part of the post-2028 product surveys, BPA envisions AE engagement in discussions with customers in addition to providing survey responses.

- Next SIG Meeting will be February 5<sup>th</sup>.
- Executive Level Overview will be February 6<sup>th</sup> (1:30 to 3:00pm at Sheraton-PDX).
- Next Executive Meeting will be targeted for late March/early April 2020.

#### **Attachment 2: RS Questions and SIG Discussion**

1. Is it BPA's intention to market the Slice and Non-Slice share in the EIM? As such EIM revenues/credits would then flow through to the Composite cost pool?

Current expectations are the BPA would market the "non-slice" share. Obligations would be determined by what is known as of T-75.

- 2. Assuming BPA elects to enter the EIM and Slice customers lock down their RTP and transmit Base Schedules to BPA by T-55 (or T-45, T-60, or other?) would this help:
  - a. Eliminate load uncertainty at T-30 for the BPA BA?
  - b. Enable BPA to better optimize the available Tier 1 System capability for purposes of bid range?
  - c. BPA to pass the Resource Sufficiency Balancing Test?
  - d. BPA to pass the Resource Sufficiency Flexible Ramp Sufficiency Test?

3. If 2a and 2b represents risk reduction and positive opportunity/benefits for BPA, would BPA consider allocating the EIM revenue/credits to the composite cost pool?

Further evaluation and discussion needed. There is uncertainty about how value would be established by locking in base schedules earlier. BPA welcomes customer ideas on this question. Considerations could include a) determining if there is customer benefit to using EIM to manage wind deviations rather than adjusting Slice; b) relating resource sufficiency as a trigger for EI/GI rate structure; c) connection between energy made available from early lock-down to a BPA system obligation that has clear benefit to the composite cost pool.

4. What are BPA's initial thoughts on whether or not it will require Slice customers to pass the Resource Sufficiency Balancing Test at the customer level (sub-BAA)? All customers?

This will be a topic of the February 25<sup>th</sup> BPA workshop. BPA welcomes customer input on how to address impacts. BPA noted that impacts that are solely financial could be managed by rate strategies, where operational impacts (e.g., hydro plant operating constraints) may have to be managed differently. Need to define the right incentives for the desired behavior and determine how rigorous of a solution is necessary.

- 5. Does BPA envision it would ever ask Slice customers to adjust their RTP in order to help BPA pass the Resource Sufficiency Balancing Test with CAISO? No
- 6. Same question if no BOS Flex were used by Slice customers but made available to BPA for passing the Resource Sufficiency Balancing Test, Resource Sufficiency Flexible Ramp Sufficiency Test, or monetizing in the EIM through adjusted bid ranges?

Further evaluation and discussion needed. BPA welcomes customer ideas on this question.

7. We assume that BPA's threshold (99% of the time for example) to pass the Resource Sufficiency Balancing Test impacts BPA's Tier 1 System Obligations like it does today. Is that correct?

It depends. The answer would be "yes" if BPA Power Services is the backup for the EIM Entity meeting the 99% threshold <u>AND</u> the calculation is over the entire rate period as done today (this would be built into Gen Inputs). The answer would be "no" if both of the "yes" conditions are not met (i.e., if the calculation is performed on a monthly basis).

8. Other EIM Entities require that their load be provided or input into BSAP by T-60 or T-75. What is BPA's thinking on this?

BPA's aspiration is that they can capture the necessary load information from existing sources and customers would not have to enter information into BSAP.

I have not received the link mentioned in your email below. Nonetheless, I wanted to let you know that PNGC is not responding to the survey. PNGC members will make their own decisions to respond individually or not.

I thought I'd take a brief moment to explain our thinking behind this decision because we don't want to convey that our non-response means we don't care or that this is not important. My view is that these issues are critically important and we care deeply. As your email indicates, we are early in policy development and in a time of profound change. In fact, our regional electric world and market has changed remarkably since the current contracts were entered in to over 10 years ago.

Personally, I think we need to start with an open dialogue process. BPA sort of started this with the Focus 2028 process (i.e. discussion about products and services, etc.) and then the effort went dormant while BPA developed and started implementation of its strategic plan. We think it makes sense to restart this effort, but I question whether a survey as structured is the right vehicle and whether the specific questions will lead to the answers we need. Some of the questions strike me like this:

1. 1. Please rank-order your most important body parts: (a) brain, (b) lungs, (c) heart, (d) left arm, (e) right arm, (f) other? (comment box)

While such a question might generate a lot of data I am not sure what information it is going to generate. I'd advocate that we resume a dialogue process that starts higher level and works toward the specific. Obviously, when we get to execution of post-2028 contracts things will be very specific. The lawyers will make sure of this I am sure. It seems to me that we need to think about the process and schedule we are working on as well. BPA has been foundational to the region's power and transmission service for decades. In fact it was 4 score and 3 years ago that BPA was created. How BPA serves power and transmission to our region is a big question. I think we can draw on lessons of past and current contracts for what has worked well and for what has worked not so well.

However, we cannot simply think about the past and current contracts. What we may need going forward may be something entirely different. Looking to the past and current contracts is important, but we should not be bound by those constraints. We should ask ourselves questions like: "what if our fundamental assumptions about the future turn out to be 100% wrong?" For example, much of the TRM's foundation was based on a premise that we needed to fairly allocate a scare resource (federal power) that was substantially below market. The wind and solar revolution has turned things our world on its head. DSIs which used to be a central feature of our region and foundational to how we paid for policies like the ResEx are gone. We used to live in a world where our primary concern was lack of energy in dry years and capacity was plentiful. Now we live in a world of energy gluts much of the time and capacity being increasingly precious. We've seen dramatic changes to the federal hydro system caused by increased costs and lost production often driven by environmental requirements. If anything, these requirements just seem to increase and cause more uncertainty.

PNGC and its members have valued BPA for decades and it is highly likely that BPA value will continue in some form after 2028. Obviously, we need specific products and services with specific terms and conditions at some point well ahead of 2028. I think we should think about a logical process and schedule to get us from where we are now to such a point. This is going to require a lot of work and I certainty think we need to get going. PNGC's decision to not respond to the survey is not a refusal to communicate or a signal that we don't sense time being important. We absolutely want to engage with BPA about the future.

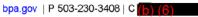

# Post-2028 – Initial Customer Input

#### Objective

Initiate BPA's Post 2028 contract design efforts with a "customer-in" approach.

#### Initial Approach

Administer AE-designed online survey as tool to gather specific customer inputs on Post 2028 topics.

- Ensures direct customer views are captured
- Avoids any potential self-censoring that may occur in "big tent" forums
- Enables BPA to understand diversity of perspectives
- Standardizes information explored and collected

#### Actions to Date

Many AE's shared courtesy previews of the survey with customers between November and mid-January. AE's began meetings with customers in January to open conversations about Post-2028 and facilitate discussions about the survey.

We had planned to push survey links to customers on 1/13, but have held on any such release.

#### **Customer Reception**

Via PPC's Executive Committee, BPA learned that some customers are concerned about BPA's survey. The Executive Committee determined that PPC members would refrain from responding to the survey. BPA expects to receive a letter signed by PPC's full Executive Committee expressing their perspective (including certain design principles) and requesting adjustments.

Importantly, customer reactions vary (from supporting the survey to not), and motivations for the reactions also vary.

Invariably, customers have expressed their interest in talking with BPA, in being heard, and support for beginning Post-2028 discussions.

#### **Proposed Adjustments**

- AE's continue planned meetings with customers through March to initiate customer listening sessions for Post 2028.
- AE's to "meet customers where they are" regarding structure and format for the conversations.
  - o If customer values structure and content of survey, AE may leverage.
  - If customer desires a more open discussion, AE will facilitate
- AE to create (or gather) summary document(s) capturing essential elements of customer conversations.
- Post 2028 working team to synthesize insights from AE summaries
- Insights leveraged for a) Executive Roadshow in May/June and b) BPA to initiate internal draft design work (goals, rate structure, products, contract term)

In September and October 2016, Bonneville held Provider of Choice conversations around the region, meeting with several customers and customer group representatives, to collect their views on the competition they are facing. The discussions also covered what competiveness means to our customers, concerns about Bonneville's competiveness, and what Bonneville needs to do to remain their provider of choice post-2028, when the Regional Dialogue power sales agreements expire. At the conclusion of the Provider of Choice conversations, Bonneville committed to periodically continue regional conversations.

In late 2019, Bonneville kicked off a post-2028 customer engagement period. From November 2019 through March 2020, Power Account Executives are meeting with their customers to gain an updated understanding of customer needs and interests regarding the products, services, contracts, and rate structure customers would like from Bonneville in the next power sales contract. By mid-2020, Bonneville will prepare a report to share aggregate results with our customers and test what Bonneville heard.

In an iterative process, Bonneville will continue the post-2028 conversations and engagement with its customers and customer representative groups as Bonneville considers the feedback collected from customers during the 2016 Provider of Choice conversations and the 2019/2020 customer engagement period. Bonneville will prepare a Post-2028 Concept Paper anticipated in 2021. The Concept Paper will outline Bonneville's policy direction on post-2028 contracts, products and rates.

Following the release of the Concept Paper, Bonneville will facilitate several workshops around the region to provide a venue for customers and customer representative groups to react to the Concept Paper and provide feedback. AEs will receive additional feedback through individual meetings with customers.

Mid-2022 through late 2023 will be spent developing the post-2028 policy and record of decision (ROD). Following release of a draft policy, Bonneville will hold a comment period and then release a final post-2028 policy and ROD. Contract negotiations and contract development will follow starting in early 2024, culminating in contract offers to its preference customers in late 2025. Power deliveries under the new post-2028 power sales agreement will start on October 1, 2028.

The timeline and actions outlined above represent the current plan and are subject to change, as Bonneville intends to be flexible and responsive to customer needs and industry changes between now and 2028.

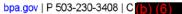

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# Post-2028 – Initial Customer Input

#### Objective

Initiate BPA's Post 2028 contract design efforts with a "customer-in" approach.

#### Initial Approach

Administer AE-designed online survey as tool to gather specific customer inputs on Post 2028 topics.

- Ensures direct customer views are captured
- Avoids any potential self-censoring that may occur in "big tent" forums
- Enables BPA to understand diversity of perspectives
- Standardizes information explored and collected

#### Actions to Date

Many AE's shared courtesy previews of the survey with customers between November and mid-January. AE's began meetings with customers in January to open conversations about Post-2028 and facilitate discussions about the survey.

We had planned to push survey links to customers on 1/13, but have held on any such release.

#### **Customer Reception**

Via PPC's Executive Committee, BPA learned that some customers are concerned about BPA's survey. The Executive Committee determined that PPC members would refrain from responding to the survey. BPA expects to receive a letter signed by PPC's full Executive Committee expressing their perspective (including certain design principles) and requesting adjustments.

Importantly, customer reactions vary (from supporting the survey to not), and motivations for the reactions also vary.

Invariably, customers have expressed their interest in talking with BPA, in being heard, and support for beginning Post-2028 discussions.

#### **Proposed Adjustments**

- AE's continue planned meetings with customers through March to initiate customer listening sessions for Post 2028.
- AE's to "meet customers where they are" regarding structure and format for the conversations.
  - o If customer values structure and content of survey, AE may leverage.
  - If customer desires a more open discussion, AE will facilitate

- Post 2028 working team to synthesize insights from AE summaries
- Insights leveraged for a) Executive Roadshow in May/June and b) BPA to initiate internal draft design work (goals, rate structure, products, contract term)

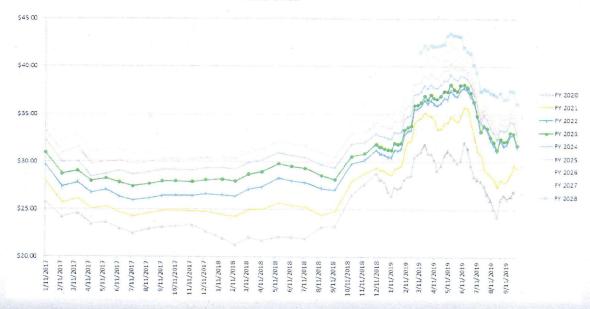

Subject: Next steps on AE engagements

Hi all – Joel and I met with John this afternoon. Attached you will see the synopsis I took to the meeting to frame our conversation.

At the end, John agrees with having the AE's continue our individual customer engagements to gain inputs from customers as we begin the Post-2028 engagement. That said, he has made a few requests.

1. If possible, he would like AE's to *pause* next week. He had two motivators for this request.

First – He would like us to develop guidance to steer the AE engagements, absent the survey structure. To that end, I am thinking a set of topic areas and/or any foundational questions we'd like some consistency around. (and for those customers who value the survey, we can use those questions). John is concerned that for those customers rejecting the question format we crafted, that our conversations may be too varied and diverse to pull together later. This fits into, and builds upon what I captured under proposed adjustments.

Second - He will be at a WEI meeting next Friday where he expects to connect with some of our customers and will probe for any additional context / input. He would like us to pause in case he has

direction to relay following his WEI meeting on Friday.

Importantly, I told John that we would honor the delay request if it is a low-impact action, but that I wouldn't want the AE's to cancel pre-scheduled meetings (remember, I'm going for "responsive" not " reactive").

- 2. John would like the AE's to pull executives into their meetings to some degree. He wants to demonstrate to a 'small sample' of customers where we believe it would be important, that our outreach has executive backing. Joel and I shared that this is happening to a degree - Joel will be at the WMG& T next week, I'll be joining the Snohomish discussion, John has been talking with Roger Gray, etc. BUT - we should think through other possible integration points. John is interested in being included.

## Adjusted Approach for AEs to Engage in Post-2028 Conversations

January 2020

## What this is

In late 2019, BPA kicked off a post-2028 customer engagement period with a questionnaire for its preference customers that was intended to elicit customers' feedback regarding the products, services, contracts, and rate structure they would like BPA to offer post-2028. Power Account Executives (AEs) are holding one-on-one customer conversations regarding customers' post-2028 interests, and BPA was going to send an electronic version of the questionnaire, a SurveyMonkey, in January. Immediately prior to BPA sending the electronic SurveyMonkey link, BPA learned some customers were concerned about BPA's survey. BPA subsequently decided to not send the SurveyMonkey electronic post-2028 questionnaire at this time.

## Key messages

- BPA's intent was, and is, to kick off the post-2028 customer engagement process by asking and listening to what our preference customers want post-2028 so that BPA remains customers' cost-based, long term power provider of choice beyond 2028. BPA wants to hear directly from its customers to ensure direct customer views are captured.
- The Executive Committee at PPC determined that PPC members should refrain from responding to the survey. However, individual customer reactions vary and the motivations for the reactions also vary.
- BPA's Power AEs will continue with their planned face-to-face meetings with customers through March to hear and understand customers' wants, needs, opinions, and concerns regarding the post-2028 products, policies, rate structure and contracts. The AEs will continue to be nimble in their approach to the conversations, and will "meet customers where they are" regarding the structure and format for the conversations.

## **Background**

In late 2019, BPA kicked off a post-2028 customer engagement period. From November 2019 through March 2020, Power Account Executives are meeting with their customers to gain an updated understanding of customer needs and interests regarding the products, services, contracts, and rate structure customers would like from BPA in the next power sales contract. BPA's goal is to be the preference customers' cost-based, long term power provider of choice beyond 2028. BPA initiated the customer engagement with a questionnaire developed by a small team of BPA Account Executives. BPA provided customers with an advance copy of the questions starting in November 2019, so that customers could prepare and discuss the questions internal to their utilities. BPA planned to follow up in January 2020 with an identical electronic SurveyMonkey version of the post-2028 questionnaire. The questions are intended to elicit customers' feedback regarding the products and services, rate structure and contracts they would like BPA to offer post-2028. Immediately prior to BPA sending the electronic SurveyMonkey link, BPA learned some customers are concerned about BPA's survey. BPA subsequently decided to not send the SurveyMonkey electronic post-2028 questionnaire at this time.

## **Questions and answers**

## 1. What actions have been taken to date on the post-2028 customer engagement?

Many AEs shared a preview of the post-2028 survey questions with customers between November and mid-January. AEs began meetings with customers in January to open conversations about post-2028 and the survey questions. BPA had planned to push the electronic SurveyMonkey links to customers on January 13, 2020, but has decided to not release the electronic survey at this time.

# 2. Why did BPA start its post-2028 customer engagement process with a questionnaire and AE face-to-face conversations? What was the intent of starting this way?

From a philosophical perspective, BPA was following-up on the 2019 Power Services Customer Satisfaction Survey and working toward: understanding the needs and challenges of our customers' business, and taking steps toward incorporating customers' input into our decisions. Additionally, we decided to *start* the post-2028 engagement process by exercising the leadership principle of "listening more than talking." Power AEs felt strongly about starting the post-2028 process by hearing directly from our customers. Some customers are not members of PPC or the other trade groups, and many members have unique interests and appreciate the opportunity to speak directly to BPA outside of the group / "big tent" settings. It is imperative that our customers know that BPA has <u>not</u> pre-decided the post-2028 strategy.

From a logistical standpoint, following up the AEs' face-to face conversations with an electronic survey tool was intended to:

- Ensure direct customer views were captured
- Avoid any potential self-censoring that may occur in "big tent" forums
- Enable BPA to understand the diversity of customer perspectives
- Allow for uniform questions to be asked and standardize the data collection.

The customer engagement process is just the first step to a long process. It is not BPA's intention to exclude PPC or other customer representative groups from the post-2028 conversation. BPA simply wants to ensure that individual customers have an opportunity to share their views, in addition to any aggregate perspectives being provided by the representative trade groups.

# 3. What has been the customer reception since November of the post-2028 customer engagement?

Customers have largely expressed appreciation for the Power AEs' one-on-one conversations on post-2028 products and services, rate structure and contracts. AEs have said that most customers have been ready and very willing to talk about post-2028 during their conversations.

Prior to the electronic SurveyMonkey version of the questionnaire being released January 13, 2020, BPA learned via PPC's Executive Committee that some customers are concerned about BPA's survey. The Executive Committee determined that PPC members should refrain from responding to the survey. BPA expects to receive a letter signed by PPC's full Executive

Committee expressing their perspective (including certain design principles) and requesting adjustments.

Importantly, customer reactions vary (from supporting the survey to not) and motivations for the reactions also vary. Invariably, customers have expressed their interest in talking with BPA, in being heard, and support for beginning post-2028 discussions.

# 4. In light of PPC Executive Board's position and the pending PPC letter, what adjustments are we making to the customer engagement process?

BPA will not be sending the formal SurveyMonkey link to the questionnaire at this time. AEs are continuing with their planned customer meetings through March. AEs will take a nimble, adaptive approach to their communications and will "meet customers where they are" regarding the structure and format for the conversations. Customers and AEs may use the questionnaire to facilitate their discussions. Alternatively, customers and AEs may decide to have a more open discussion about post-2028 at this time. BPA will conclude their conversations at the end of March, as scheduled.

The customer engagement process is just the first step to a long process and was never meant to be the start of detailed contract negotiations. Once BPA receives PPC's letter from their Executive Committee, BPA will adjust and respond accordingly. We are interested in knowing how PPC, its members, and other customer representative groups want to engage with BPA on post-2028 moving forward. We know that not all of our customers are represented by PPC or other representative groups, and BPA is committed in continuing to engage with all our preference customers directly.

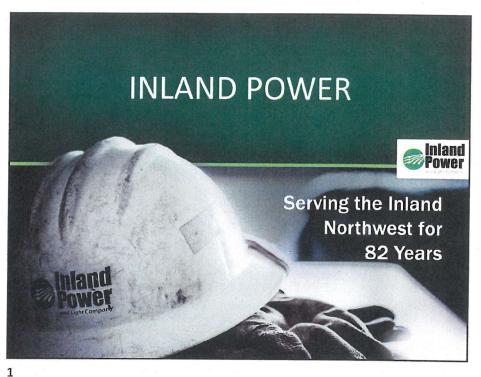
# 5. Without the SurveyMonkey, how will BPA collect the information that the AEs heard during their conversations?

AEs will create or gather summary documents capturing the essential elements and themes from their customer conversations. In addition to the established questionnaire, the post-2028 working team will give AEs some direction on foundational questions and topic areas, and themes of information that BPA would like AEs to gather from their customers. For instance, we want to know: are customers happy with their current product purchase from BPA? Would they want to see the same, similar, or vastly different product offerings post-2028? In April 2020, the post 2028 working team will synthesize insights from AEs' summaries and develop a summary document.

## 6. How will BPA use the feedback received during the conversations?

BPA will consider feedback collected from customers during the 2016 Provider of Choice conversations and the 2019/2020 customer engagement period as we prepare BPA's post-2028 concept paper anticipated in late 2021. The concept paper will outline BPA's policy direction on post-2028 contracts, products and rates. BPA will, of course, engage with its customers and customer representative groups between 2020 and 2021 as we develop the concept paper. As a next step in that engagement, BPA is considering an executive "road show" where BPA could report out its key takeaways from the conversations to date and confirm that we accurately captured customer viewpoints.

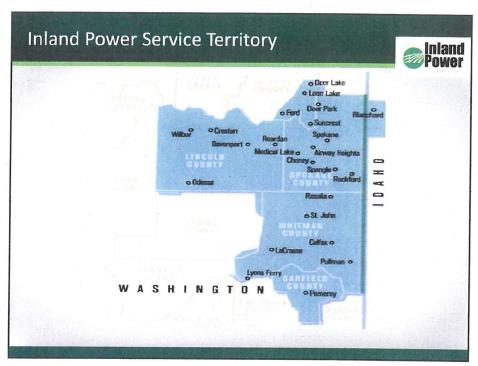
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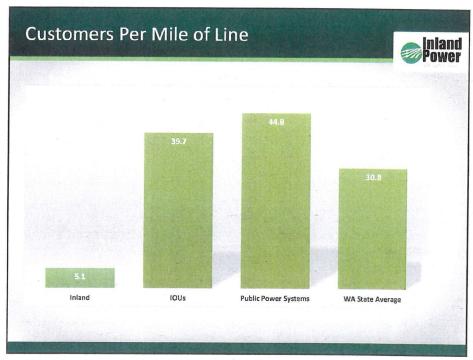


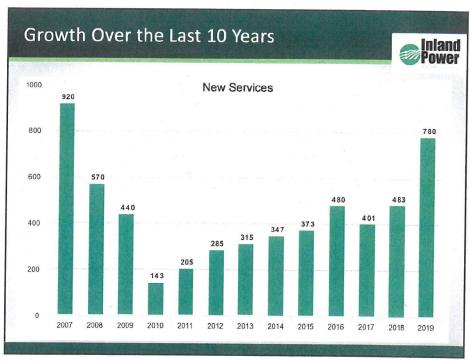

## Question:

"Discuss Bonneville's actions to renew the power sales contracts with its preference customers after 2028?"

## Response:

In September and October 2016, Bonneville held "Provider of Choice" conversations around the region, meeting with several customers and customer group representatives to collect their views regarding future power supply needs. The discussions also covered what competiveness means to our customers, concerns about Bonneville's competiveness, and what Bonneville needs to do to remain their provider of choice post-2028 when existing power sales agreements expire. At the conclusion of the Provider of Choice conversations, Bonneville committed to periodically continue regional conversations.

In late 2019, Bonneville kicked off a post-2028 customer engagement period. From November 2019 through spring 2020, Power Account Executives are meeting with their customers to gain an updated understanding of customer needs and interests regarding the products, services, contracts, and rate structure customers would like from Bonneville in the next power sales contract. By mid-2020, Bonneville plans to share aggregate results with our customers and test what Bonneville heard.

In an iterative process, Bonneville will continue the post-2028 conversations and engagement with its customers and customer representative groups as Bonneville considers the feedback collected during the 2016 Provider of Choice conversations and the 2019/2020 customer engagement period. Bonneville plans to prepare a Post-2028 Concept Paper anticipated in late-2021. The Concept Paper will outline Bonneville's policy direction on post-2028 contracts, products and rates.

Following the release of the Concept Paper, Bonneville expects to move into a multi-year policy and contract development phase where the agency will work with customers and regional stakeholders to further refine policy details and transition into contract negotiation. This phase would feature extensive public engagement including workshops around the region to provide venues for customers and stakeholders to react to and provide feedback on agency proposals. During this phase Bonneville also expects to produce a post-2028 policy and record of decision (ROD) where Bonneville will formally seek public comment. Contract negotiations and contract development would follow starting in early 2024, culminating in contract offers to its preference customers in late 2025. Power deliveries under the new post-2028 power sales agreement will start on October 1, 2028.

The timeline and actions outlined above represent the current plan and are subject to change, as Bonneville intends to be flexible and responsive to customer needs and industry changes between now and 2028.

Subject: Next steps on AE engagements

Hi all – Joel and I met with John this afternoon. Attached you will see the synopsis I took to the meeting to frame our conversation.

At the end, John agrees with having the AE's continue our individual customer engagements to gain inputs from customers as we begin the Post-2028 engagement. That said, he has made a few requests.

1. If possible, he would like AE's to *pause* next week. He had two motivators for this request.

First – He would like us to develop guidance to steer the AE engagements, absent the survey structure. To that end, I am thinking a set of topic areas and/or any foundational questions we'd like some consistency around. (and for those customers who value the survey, we can use those questions). John is concerned that for those customers rejecting the question format we crafted, that our conversations may be too varied and diverse to pull together later. This fits into, and builds upon what I captured under proposed adjustments.

Second - He will be at a WEI meeting next Friday where he expects to connect with some of our customers and will probe for any additional context / input. He would like us to pause in case he has direction to relay following his WEI meeting on Friday.

Importantly, I told John that we would honor the delay request if it is a low-impact action, but that I wouldn't want the AE's to cancel pre-scheduled meetings (remember, I'm going for "responsive" not "reactive").

2. John would like the AE's to pull executives into their meetings to some degree. He wants to demonstrate to a 'small sample' of customers where we

believe it would be important, that our outreach has executive backing. Joel and I shared that this is happening to a degree – Joel will be at the WMG&T next week, I'll be joining the Snohomish discussion, John has been talking with Roger Gray, etc. BUT – we should think through other possible integration points. John is interested in being included.

- 3. John would like some messaging / talking points about what we're doing, why, how we're adapting our approach, etc. for his reference ahead of the WEI meeting. He'd like something Wed / Thurs
- 4. John asked for us to put some more flesh on our project planning for the year. I believe I gave him the more detailed workplan that the team build mid-December but it is worth re-tooling. He is also open to alternatives to the exec roadshow. He'd like a meeting with himself and Elliot to concur with the next steps and generally requested a 'no surprises' demeanor in how we're approaching this important work.

# Adjusted Approach for AEs to Engage in Post-2028 Conversations January 2020

## What this is

In late 2019, BPA kicked off a post-2028 customer engagement period with a questionnaire for its preference customers that was intended to elicit customers' feedback regarding the products, services, contracts, and rate structure they would like BPA to offer post-2028. Power Account Executives (AEs) are holding one-on-one customer conversations regarding customers' post-2028 interests, and BPA was going to send an electronic version of the questionnaire, a SurveyMonkey, in January. Immediately prior to BPA sending the electronic SurveyMonkey link, BPA learned some customers were concerned about BPA's survey. BPA subsequently decided to not send the SurveyMonkey electronic post-2028 questionnaire at this time.

## Key messages

- BPA's intent was, and is, to kick off the post-2028 customer engagement process by
  asking and listening to what our preference customers want post-2028 so that BPA
  remains customers' cost-based, long term power provider of choice beyond 2028. BPA
  wants to hear directly from its customers to ensure direct customer views are captured.
- The Executive Committee at PPC determined that PPC members should refrain from responding to the survey. However, individual customer reactions vary and the motivations for the reactions also vary.
- BPA's Power AEs will continue with their planned face-to-face meetings with customers through March to hear and understand customers' wants, needs, opinions, and concerns regarding the post-2028 products, policies, rate structure and contracts. The AEs will continue to be nimble in their approach to the conversations, and will "meet customers where they are" regarding the structure and format for the conversations.

## **Background**

In late 2019, BPA kicked off a post-2028 customer engagement period. From November 2019 through March 2020, Power Account Executives are meeting with their customers to gain an updated understanding of customer needs and interests regarding the products, services, contracts, and rate structure customers would like from BPA in the next power sales contract. BPA's goal is to be the preference customers' cost-based, long term power provider of choice beyond 2028. BPA initiated the customer engagement with a questionnaire developed by a small team of BPA Account Executives. BPA provided customers with an advance copy of the questions starting in November 2019, so that customers could prepare and discuss the questions internal to their utilities. BPA planned to follow up in January 2020 with an identical electronic SurveyMonkey version of the post-2028 questionnaire. The questions are intended to elicit customers' feedback regarding the products and services, rate structure and contracts they would like BPA to offer post-2028. Immediately prior to BPA sending the electronic SurveyMonkey link, BPA learned some customers are concerned about BPA's survey. BPA subsequently decided to not send the SurveyMonkey electronic post-2028 questionnaire at this time.

#### **Questions and answers**

#### 1. What actions have been taken to date on the post-2028 customer engagement?

Many AEs shared a preview of the post-2028 survey questions with customers between November and mid-January. AEs began meetings with customers in January to open conversations about post-2028 and the survey questions. BPA had planned to push the electronic SurveyMonkey links to customers on January 13, 2020, but has decided to not release the electronic survey at this time.

# 2. Why did BPA start its post-2028 customer engagement process with a questionnaire and AE face-to-face conversations? What was the intent of starting this way?

From a philosophical perspective, BPA was following-up on the 2019 Power Services Customer Satisfaction Survey and working toward: understanding the needs and challenges of our customers' business, and taking steps toward incorporating customers' input into our decisions. Additionally, we decided to *start* the post-2028 engagement process by exercising the leadership principle of "listening more than talking." Power AEs felt strongly about starting the post-2028 process by hearing directly from our customers. Some customers are not members of PPC or the other trade groups, and many members have unique interests and appreciate the opportunity to speak directly to BPA outside of the group / "big tent" settings. It is imperative that our customers know that BPA has <u>not</u> pre-decided the post-2028 strategy.

From a logistical standpoint, following up the AEs' face-to face conversations with an electronic survey tool was intended to:

- Ensure direct customer views were captured
- Avoid any potential self-censoring that may occur in "big tent" forums
- Enable BPA to understand the diversity of customer perspectives
- Allow for uniform questions to be asked and standardize the data collection.

The customer engagement process is just the first step to a long process. It is not BPA's intention to exclude PPC or other customer representative groups from the post-2028 conversation. BPA simply wants to ensure that individual customers have an opportunity to share their views, in addition to any aggregate perspectives being provided by the representative trade groups.

# 3. What has been the customer reception since November of the post-2028 customer engagement?

Customers have largely expressed appreciation for the Power AEs' one-on-one conversations on post-2028 products and services, rate structure and contracts. AEs have said that most customers have been ready and very willing to talk about post-2028 during their conversations.

Prior to the electronic SurveyMonkey version of the questionnaire being released January 13, 2020, BPA learned via PPC's Executive Committee that some customers are concerned about BPA's survey. The Executive Committee determined that PPC members should refrain from responding to the survey. BPA expects to receive a letter signed by PPC's full Executive

Committee expressing their perspective (including certain design principles) and requesting adjustments.

Importantly, customer reactions vary (from supporting the survey to not) and motivations for the reactions also vary. Invariably, customers have expressed their interest in talking with BPA, in being heard, and support for beginning post-2028 discussions.

# 4. In light of PPC Executive Board's position and the pending PPC letter, what adjustments are we making to the customer engagement process?

BPA will not be sending the formal SurveyMonkey link to the questionnaire at this time. AEs are continuing with their planned customer meetings through March. AEs will take a nimble, adaptive approach to their communications and will "meet customers where they are" regarding the structure and format for the conversations. Customers and AEs may use the questionnaire to facilitate their discussions. Alternatively, customers and AEs may decide to have a more open discussion about post-2028 at this time. BPA will conclude their conversations at the end of March, as scheduled.

The customer engagement process is just the first step to a long process and was never meant to be the start of detailed contract negotiations. Once BPA receives PPC's letter from their Executive Committee, BPA will adjust and respond accordingly. We are interested in knowing how PPC, its members, and other customer representative groups want to engage with BPA on post-2028 moving forward. We know that not all of our customers are represented by PPC or other representative groups, and BPA is committed in continuing to engage with all our preference customers directly.

# 5. Without the SurveyMonkey, how will BPA collect the information that the AEs heard during their conversations?

AEs will create or gather summary documents capturing the essential elements and themes from their customer conversations. In addition to the established questionnaire, the post-2028 working team will give AEs some direction on foundational questions and topic areas, and themes of information that BPA would like AEs to gather from their customers. For instance, we want to know: are customers happy with their current product purchase from BPA? Would they want to see the same, similar, or vastly different product offerings post-2028? In April 2020, the post 2028 working team will synthesize insights from AEs' summaries and develop a summary document.

#### 6. How will BPA use the feedback received during the conversations?

BPA will consider feedback collected from customers during the 2016 Provider of Choice conversations and the 2019/2020 customer engagement period as we prepare BPA's post-2028 concept paper anticipated in late 2021. The concept paper will outline BPA's policy direction on post-2028 contracts, products and rates. BPA will, of course, engage with its customers and customer representative groups between 2020 and 2021 as we develop the concept paper. As a next step in that engagement, BPA is considering an executive "road show" where BPA could report out its key takeaways from the conversations to date and confirm that we accurately captured customer viewpoints.

Not sure how final the bond document is, but they might benefit from hearing the statement that our lead time is generous relative to prior negotiations, and that we're essentially "ahead of schedule" in that regard. Never hurts to be too explicit in that sort of thing, especially since that audience is fairly removed from our business.

On the talking points, two thoughts/suggestions (at your discretion, all):

- 1) Same as above, might be worthwhile to do a Q&A on schedule and how we're comfortable. For the talking point document with the internal audience you might add something along the lines of not wanting to start conversations too early in light of the guaranteed cost recovery for the majority of BPA's revenue the RD contracts represent. Essentially there's a downside to moving too fast on this.
- 2) They look a lot like the agency approved talking points, but I'm not sure how involved the communications folks have been. I've seen similar instances of groups developing independent TPs for exec use and comms can get touchy. So, if you have time, you might ask Abigail or someone to run through their process. Would result in them being posted to the internal website for all exec/AE uses. Other option would be to scale it back on the professional look and treat these more like a one off.

I have not received the link mentioned in your email below. Nonetheless, I wanted to let you know that PNGC is not responding to the survey. PNGC members will make their own decisions to respond individually or not.

I thought I'd take a brief moment to explain our thinking behind this decision because we don't want to convey that our non-response means we don't care or that this is not important. My view is that these issues are critically important and we care deeply. As your email indicates, we are early in policy development and in a time of profound change. In fact, our regional electric world and market has changed remarkably since the current contracts were entered in to over 10 years ago.

Personally, I think we need to start with an open dialogue process. BPA sort of started this with the Focus 2028 process (i.e. discussion about products and services, etc.) and then the effort went dormant while BPA developed and started implementation of its strategic plan. We think it makes sense to restart this effort, but I question whether a survey as structured is the right vehicle and whether the specific questions will lead to the answers we need. Some of the questions strike me like this:

1. 1. Please rank-order your most important body parts: (a) brain, (b) lungs, (c) heart, (d) left arm, (e) right arm, (f) other? (comment box)

While such a question might generate a lot of data I am not sure what information it is going to generate. I'd advocate that we resume a dialogue process that starts higher level and works toward the specific. Obviously, when we get to execution of post-2028 contracts things will be very specific. The lawyers will make sure of this I am sure. It seems to me that we need to think about the process and schedule we are working on as well. BPA has been foundational to the region's power and transmission service for decades. In fact it was 4 score and 3 years ago that BPA was created. How BPA serves power and transmission to our region is a big question. I think we can draw on lessons of past and current contracts for what has worked well and for what has worked not so well.

However, we cannot simply think about the past and current contracts. What we may need going forward may be something entirely different. Looking to the past and current contracts is important, but we should not be bound by those constraints. We should ask ourselves questions like: "what if our fundamental assumptions about the future turn out to be 100% wrong?" For example, much of the TRM's foundation was based on a premise that we needed to fairly allocate a scare resource (federal power) that was substantially below market. The wind and solar revolution has turned things our world on its head. DSIs which used to be a central feature of our region and foundational to how we paid for policies like the ResEx are gone. We used to live in a world where our primary concern was lack of energy in dry years and capacity was plentiful. Now we live in a world of energy gluts much of the time and capacity being increasingly precious. We've seen dramatic changes to the federal hydro system caused by increased costs and lost production often driven by environmental requirements. If anything, these requirements just seem to increase and cause more uncertainty.

PNGC and its members have valued BPA for decades and it is highly likely that BPA value will continue in some form after 2028. Obviously, we need specific products and services with specific terms and conditions at some point well ahead of 2028. I think we should think about a logical process and schedule to get us from where we are now to such a point. This is going to require a lot of work and I certainty think we need to get going. PNGC's decision to not respond to the survey is not a refusal to communicate or a signal that we don't sense time being important. We absolutely want to engage with BPA about the future.

<u>To:</u> **Products and Services** – Explore customer interest in contracting for similar products and services to today versus their interest in different products and services post-2028. Seek to understand product/service features that the customer values.

<u>From:</u> Does the customer want BPA to maintain the current tiered rate structure in the future? Or some other rate structure?

To: FCRPS Allocation and Rate Structure - Explore customer's desire to retain TRM or TRM-like

construct or if they wish to explore alternative structures. Probe to understand customer's motivations or considerations for their perspective.

# **Q&As:** BPA's Adjusted Approach for AEs to Engage in Post-2028 Conversations

January 2020

#### **Background**

In late 2019, BPA kicked off a post-2028 customer engagement period. From November 2019 through March 2020, Power Account Executives are meeting with their customers to gain an updated understanding of customer needs and interests regarding the products, services, contracts, and rate structure customers would like from BPA in the next power sales contract. BPA's goal is to be the preference customers' cost-based, long term power provider of choice beyond 2028. BPA initiated the customer engagement with a questionnaire developed by a small team of BPA Account Executives. BPA provided customers with an advance copy of the questions starting in November 2019, so that customers could prepare and discuss the questions internal to their utilities. BPA planned to follow up in January 2020 with an identical electronic SurveyMonkey version of the post-2028 questionnaire. The questions are intended to elicit customers' feedback regarding the products and services, rate structure and contracts they would like BPA to offer post-2028. Immediately prior to BPA sending the electronic SurveyMonkey link, BPA learned some customers are concerned about BPA's survey. BPA subsequently decided to not send the SurveyMonkey electronic post-2028 questionnaire at this time.

#### Key messages

- BPA's intent was, and is, to kick off the post-2028 customer engagement process by
  asking and listening to what our preference customers want post-2028 so that BPA
  remains customers' cost-based, long term power provider of choice beyond 2028. BPA
  wants to hear directly from its customers to ensure direct customer views are captured.
- The Executive Committee at PPC determined that PPC members should refrain from responding to the survey. However, individual customer reactions vary and the motivations for the reactions also vary.
- BPA's Power AEs will continue with their planned face-to-face meetings with customers through March to hear and understand customers' wants, needs, opinions, and concerns regarding the post-2028 products, policies, rate structure and contracts. The AEs will continue to be nimble in their approach to the conversations, and will "meet customers where they are" regarding the structure and format for the conversations.

#### **Questions and answers**

#### 1. What actions have been taken to date on the post-2028 customer engagement?

Many AEs shared a preview of the post-2028 survey questions with customers between November and mid-January. AEs began meetings with customers in January to open conversations about post-2028 and the survey questions. BPA had planned to push the electronic SurveyMonkey links to customers on January 13, 2020, but has decided to not release the electronic survey at this time.

## 2. Why did BPA start its post-2028 customer engagement process with a questionnaire and AE face-to-face conversations? What was the intent of starting this way?

From a philosophical perspective, BPA was following-up on the 2019 Power Services Customer Satisfaction Survey and working toward: understanding the needs and challenges of our customers' business, and taking steps toward incorporating customers' input into our decisions. Additionally, we decided to *start* the post-2028 engagement process by exercising the leadership principle of "listening more than talking." Power AEs felt strongly about starting the post-2028 process by hearing directly from our customers. Some customers are not members of PPC or the other trade groups, and many members have unique interests and appreciate the opportunity to speak directly to BPA outside of the group / "big tent" settings. It is imperative that our customers know that BPA has <u>not</u> pre-decided the post-2028 strategy.

From a logistical standpoint, following up the AEs' face-to face conversations with an electronic survey tool was intended to:

- Ensure direct customer views were captured
- Avoid any potential self-censoring that may occur in "big tent" forums
- Enable BPA to understand the diversity of customer perspectives
- Allow for uniform questions to be asked and standardize the data collection.

The customer engagement process is just the first step to a long process. It is not BPA's intention to exclude PPC or other customer representative groups from the post-2028 conversation. BPA simply wants to ensure that individual customers have an opportunity to share their views, in addition to any aggregate perspectives being provided by the representative trade groups.

# 3. What has been the customer reception since November of the post-2028 customer engagement?

Customers have largely expressed appreciation for the Power AEs' one-on-one conversations on post-2028 products and services, rate structure and contracts. AEs have said that most customers have been ready and very willing to talk about post-2028 during their conversations.

Prior to the electronic SurveyMonkey version of the questionnaire being released January 13, 2020, BPA learned via PPC's Executive Committee that some customers are concerned about BPA's survey. The Executive Committee determined that PPC members should refrain from responding to the survey. BPA expects to receive a letter signed by PPC's full Executive Committee expressing their perspective (including certain design principles) and requesting adjustments.

Importantly, customer reactions vary (from supporting the survey to not) and motivations for the reactions also vary. Invariably, customers have expressed their interest in talking with BPA, in being heard, and support for beginning post-2028 discussions.

# 4. In light of PPC Executive Board's position and the pending PPC letter, what adjustments are we making to the customer engagement process?

BPA will not be sending the formal SurveyMonkey link to the questionnaire at this time. AEs are continuing with their planned customer meetings through March. AEs will take a nimble, adaptive approach to their communications and will "meet customers where they are" regarding the structure and format for the conversations. Customers and AEs may use the questionnaire to facilitate their discussions. Alternatively, customers and AEs may decide to have a more open discussion about post-2028 at this time. BPA will conclude their conversations at the end of March, as scheduled.

The customer engagement process is just the first step to a long process and was never meant to be the start of detailed contract negotiations. Once BPA receives PPC's letter from their Executive Committee, BPA will adjust and respond accordingly. We are interested in knowing how PPC, its members, and other customer representative groups want to engage with BPA on post-2028 moving forward. We know that not all of our customers are represented by PPC or other representative groups, and BPA is committed in continuing to engage with all our preference customers directly.

# 5. Without the SurveyMonkey, how will BPA collect the information that the AEs heard during their conversations?

AEs will create or gather summary documents capturing the essential elements and themes from their customer conversations. In addition to the established questionnaire, the post-2028 working team will give AEs some direction on foundational questions and topic areas, and themes of information that BPA would like AEs to gather from their customers. For instance, we want to know: are customers happy with their current product purchase from BPA? Would they want to see the same, similar, or vastly different product offerings post-2028? In April 2020, the post 2028 working team will synthesize insights from AEs' summaries and develop a summary document.

#### 6. How will BPA use the feedback received during the conversations?

BPA will consider feedback collected from customers during the 2016 Provider of Choice conversations and the 2019/2020 customer engagement period as we prepare BPA's post-2028 concept paper anticipated in late 2021. The concept paper will outline BPA's policy direction on post-2028 contracts, products and rates. BPA will, of course, engage with its customers and customer representative groups between 2020 and 2021 as we develop the concept paper. As a next step in that engagement, BPA is considering an executive "road show" where BPA could report out its key takeaways from the conversations to date and confirm that we accurately captured customer viewpoints.

#### **Themes for Post-2028 Conversations**

Below are some themes/focus areas that the AEs can use to draw information from customers that are not able or willing at this time to discuss the developed post-2028 questionnaire:

- Products and Services Explore customer interest in contracting for similar products and services to
  today versus their interest in different products and services post-2028. Seek to understand
  product/service features that the customer values, and what could be improved.
- FCRPS Allocation and Rate Structure Explore customer's desire to retain TRM or TRM-like construct, or if they wish to explore alternative structures. Probe to understand customer's motivations or considerations for their perspective.
- Rate Case Frequency- Get customer feedback on BPA current rate case frequency. If they prefer longer time between rate cases, seek to understand motivations.
- **Contract Term** Explore customer's interest in a long-term contract verses short-term, and whether there are features (e.g. off-ramps) or incentives that could encourage longer-term commitments.
- **Cost control, competitiveness and Public Benefits** Test the tensions between cost control/competitiveness and public benefit programs (such as IRD/LDD benefits).
- Carbon Free Products Assess customer interest or other perspectives around Carbon free resources in BPA's product offerings.
- **Top Concerns** Seek to gain insight on customer's top concerns as they look beyond 2028. Explore what is most critical in the utility decision to make BPA their provider of choice.

I have not received the link mentioned in your email below. Nonetheless, I wanted to let you know that PNGC is not responding to the survey. PNGC members will make their own decisions to respond individually or not.

I thought I'd take a brief moment to explain our thinking behind this decision because we don't want to convey that our non-response means we don't care or that this is not important. My view is that these issues are critically important and we care deeply. As your email indicates, we are early in policy development and in a time of profound change. In fact, our regional electric world and market has changed remarkably since the current contracts were entered in to over 10 years ago.

Personally, I think we need to start with an open dialogue process. BPA sort of started this with the Focus 2028 process (i.e. discussion about products and services, etc.) and then the effort went dormant while BPA developed and started implementation of its strategic plan. We think it makes sense to restart this effort, but I question whether a survey as structured is the right vehicle and whether the specific questions will lead to the answers we need. Some of the questions strike me like this:

1. Please rank-order your most important body parts: (a) brain, (b) lungs, (c) heart, (d) left arm, (e) right arm, (f) other? (comment box)

While such a question might generate a lot of data I am not sure what information it is going to generate. I'd advocate that we resume a dialogue process that starts higher level and works toward the specific. Obviously, when we get to execution of post-2028 contracts things will be very specific. The lawyers will make sure of this I am sure. It seems to me that we need to think about the process and schedule we are working on as well. BPA has been foundational to the region's power and transmission service for decades. In fact it was 4 score and 3 years ago that BPA was created. How BPA serves power and transmission to our region is a big question. I think we can draw on lessons of past and current contracts for what has worked well and for what has worked not so well.

However, we cannot simply think about the past and current contracts. What we may need going forward may be something entirely different. Looking to the past and current contracts is important, but we should not be bound by those constraints. We should ask ourselves questions like: "what if our fundamental assumptions about the future turn out to be 100% wrong?" For example, much of the TRM's foundation was based on a premise that we needed to fairly allocate a scare resource (federal power) that was substantially below market. The wind and solar revolution

has turned things our world on its head. DSIs which used to be a central feature of our region and foundational to how we paid for policies like the ResEx are gone. We used to live in a world where our primary concern was lack of energy in dry years and capacity was plentiful. Now we live in a world of energy gluts much of the time and capacity being increasingly precious. We've seen dramatic changes to the federal hydro system caused by increased costs and lost production often driven by environmental requirements. If anything, these requirements just seem to increase and cause more uncertainty.

PNGC and its members have valued BPA for decades and it is highly likely that BPA value will continue in some form after 2028. Obviously, we need specific products and services with specific terms and conditions at some point well ahead of 2028. I think we should think about a logical process and schedule to get us from where we are now to such a point. This is going to require a lot of work and I certainty think we need to get going. PNGC's decision to not respond to the survey is not a refusal to communicate or a signal that we don't sense time being important. We absolutely want to engage with BPA about the future.
