Dear Mr. Braden,

This communication is the Bonneville Power Administration's (BPA) acknowledgment and response to your request for agency records and information, made under the Freedom of Information Act, 5 U.S.C. § 552 (FOIA). Your request was received on February 18, 2022, and assigned tracking number BPA-2022-00408-F. Please use that number in any correspondence with the agency regarding your FOIA request.

Request

- "The utility cost (water, gas, electric, etc[.]) for calendar years 2018 (beginning) 2021 (end) for BPA.
- The cost of rented/leased office space BPA utilizes for calendar years 2018 (beginning)-2021 (end).
- How many employees have been allowed to remote work at BPA and the dates they started the remote work for the years 2018 (beginning) 2021 (end) and what department these employees are from.
- How many new hires have been terminated during their probationary period and when in their period where [sic] they terminated?"

Between February 18 and February 22, you clarified your request as follows:

- "The utility cost (water, gas, electric, etc) for calendar years 2018(beginning)-2021(end) for BPA for office spaces only, for the following locations: Portland, Vancouver, and Seattle
- The cost of rented/leased office space BPA utilizes for calendar years 2018(beginning)-2021(end) for the following locations: Portland, Vancouver, and Seattle
- How many employees have been allowed to remote work at BPA and the dates they started the remote work for <u>calendar</u> years 2018 (beginning) -2021 (end) and what department these employees are from; <u>and for same time frame</u>, <u>number of employees</u> teleworking 100% but . . . not classified as remote work.
- For calendar years 2018 to 2021, how many new hires have been terminated during their probationary period and when in their period where they terminated?"

Telework

BPA employees record telework using two codes, TELS and TELR. The table below shows how many employees recorded 100% of their time under TELS, TELR, or a combination of the two.

Most telework-eligible employees use TELS and/or TELR in combination with other codes, including AL (annual leave), SL (sick leave), and REG (time at assigned BPA facility). The table below shows how many employees teleworked for 51-99% of their total hours.

The remaining BPA employees are either not telework-eligible due to the nature of their job, or teleworked for less than 50% of time recorded during the given year.

Terminations during Probationary Period

- In 2018, four employees were terminated during their probationary period. They were terminated at 51, 65, 274, and 361 days into the probationary period.
- In 2019, two employees were terminated during their probationary period. They were terminated at 172 and 337 days into the probationary period.
- In 2020, two employees were terminated during their probationary period. They were terminated at 32 and 305 days into the probationary period.
- In 2021, three employees were terminated during their probationary period. They were terminated at 199, 220, and 354 days into the probationary period.

The written appeal, including the envelope, must clearly indicate that a FOIA appeal is being made. You may also submit your appeal by e-mail to OHA.filings@hq.doe.gov, including the phrase "Freedom of Information Appeal" in the subject line. (The Office of Hearings and Appeals prefers to receive appeals by email.) The appeal must contain all the elements required by 10 C.F.R. § 1004.8, including a copy of the determination letter. Thereafter, judicial review will be available to you in the Federal District Court either (1) in the district where you reside, (2) where you have your principal place of business, (3) where DOE's records are situated, or (4) in the District of Columbia.
