UPDATE: Regarding Shooting Investigation on E. Hawthorne Road

Spokane County Sheriff's Office Major Crimes Detectives continue investigating the shooting that occurred on September 30, 2023, at approximately 11:15 am, in the 2400 block of E. Hawthorne Road.

Initial information gleaned from interviews of witnesses, involved parties, and evidence, it appears at this early point of the investigation that the incident began when two individuals were contacted by security for trespassing on federal land (Bonneville Power Administration/Department of Energy), which was clearly marked by signage.

During the contact, a heated verbal exchange between security and one of the suspected trespassers escalated into a physical altercation. Statements indicate at some point, the second suspected trespasser entered the physical altercation with security, who was armed and by himself. Uninvolved witnesses stated the two males appeared to be aggressive toward, or actually fighting with, the lone security, who fired his weapon, striking the two males.

One adult male was pronounced deceased at the scene, and the second adult male was transported to the hospital, where he remains, for additional care.

Major Crimes Detectives and Forensic Unit Technicians documented the scene and collected evidence.

This remains an active and ongoing investigation. No charges have been filed, and no further information is available.

The Spokane Medical Examiner's Office will release the name, along with the cause and manner of death, at a later time when appropriate.

Original release of information on September 30, 2023:

Major Crimes Detectives Investigate Shooting on E. Hawthorne

Spokane County Sheriff's Office Major Crimes Detectives were called to the scene of a shooting in the 2400 block of E. Hawthorne Road.

On September 30, 2023, at approximately 11:15 am, Spokane County Sheriff's Office Deputies responded to 911 calls regarding a shooting in the 2400 block of E. Hawthorne Road. Initial callers reported that a security guard at the location was involved in some kind of altercation with two subjects who were shot during a struggle, and law enforcement was needed.

Deputies, Spokane Police Officers, and medical personnel arrived to find two wounded subjects. One was pronounced deceased at the scene, and the second suffered what appears to be a gunshot wound and was transported to the hospital.

Major Crimes Detectives were called, along with Forensic Unit Technicians, to process and document the scene. SIRT Team Volunteers also responded to assist with traffic control.

The Spokane Medical Examiner's Office will release the name, along with the cause and manner of death, at a later time when appropriate. The second subject continues to receive medical treatment and evaluation.

The security guard was not seriously injured.

This remains an active investigation in its very early stages, and no additional information is available at this time.



Reporters know this is likely to happen and will be monitoring publicly available court documents to track and report on the incident. There is a small chance a lazy reporter could post these documents in their entirety, which include more information (addresses, etc.) than should be shared publicly. Kevin is monitoring the media reports and will likely catch

these quickly. If personal information is made available, we'll need to quickly contact the outlet that does it and have them pull down the info. Corporal Gregory thinks this is unlikely – but you never know.

Jackson and others,

With your questions below I need to get my management and physical security approval to take this system offline.

So, everyone is aware. If we take the hard disk out of the razberri (NVR)at bell (the location of the stored video files). Bell 230, 500 and MHQ will lose 30 cameras and it would take a minimum of 2 weeks to get a razberri installed and configured to replace this unit. Also, by removing this unit off of our system the video footage will be rendered useless. All oclularis video is encrypted by the software and to my knowledge cant be retrieved. I do not see this as being needed as we can just delete the video files for the 30th only.

I talked to Ocularis today on the phone and they showed me how to go into the system and delete just the files for the 30th. That will remove the data in question. Video files for the one day are 387 Gigabits of footage.

To remove just the data for the two cameras in questions I would move then to a new razberri which will cause the system to purge all the old data. If I do this just to the cameras in question, we will lose 45 days of data for these cameras. 2 cameras are in question.

I can provide a list of all BPA people that have access to view this video, but a quick list is. All Dittmer and MSC AMS, NNT security specialist and my team. No transmission people at bell have the ability to pull of old video they can only view cameras live.

I will be back in PDX tomorrow afternoon. Just let me know what the next steps you would like me to take.

All:

I spoke with Sean Barry about this issue. Here is our recommendation.

We should make a copy of what was given to the DOE IG and Sheriff's Office for potential use in civil litigation in the future. That copy can be stored with Sean's Cyber group.

We both have concerns about access to the shooting video. Understanding the operational issues with the 45 day reset, our recommendation is to make a copy of the current 45 day footage, and then reset the system to take away the possibility of access to the shooting video. The 45 day copy can be accessed by authorized individuals in the future, if necessary. We think this should take care of potential operational issues, as well as unauthorized access and copying via cell phone.

Let us know if that works. If it does not, I will go ahead and ask for additional guidance from the DOE IG.

I spoke with Noah. To make sure I have this right, both the Sheriff and DOE IG have pristine copies of the footage already. The problem now is that various individuals that have access to the video system may be (unfortunately) inclined to take cell phone images of the footage. But if we pull the footage from Saturday all footage is lost for 45 days. (The shooting footage will automatically drop off the system 45 days from Saturday, when it happened). Let me know if that is incorrect.

I am inclined to pull the footage so that others don't have access but I understand the operational difficulties of pulling it and losing 45 days of coverage.

I will attempt to contact the DOE IG investigators and see what their thoughts are. Perhaps they do not feel that this is a concern to keep as is for the normal operational 45 day period. I will get back to everyone as soon as I can.

Hi Paul,

Sarah Laylo wanted us to reach out to you regarding locking down the access to video of Munro/Bell Officer Involved Shooting. The video resides on a saved copy with NNT as well as within the Ocularis (program our cameras are run through) drives. Per JLS, our only means of restricting the Ocularis footage is to delete it from the Ocularis servers.

Unfortunately, if we choose to do that it will also delete saved video from the previous 45 days from the selected cameras. Right now, we are choosing not to pursue the deletion due to the impact to records management. However, in keeping the video on the Ocularis servers, it allow access to any privileged user with access to those cameras. Generally, the only privileged users are AMS operators, NNT personnel, and some yard personnel or leadership from their respective substations or locations to support day to day operations. Our concern lies with non-security personnel and the potential for them to download the incident footage inherently increasing the potential for unauthorized access or transmission of the information.

Can you please provide us some advice on the assumed risk with deleting the Ocularis footage to control access and the issues with records management?

Would it be possible for John to add something like: I want to stress that this was/appears to have been an isolated event, and there is no indication of an increased threat to staff at any of our substations or other facilities. Maybe it's not necessary if you're not hearing concerns/questions from people along those lines. Sarah's 2 cents... I don't think this is necessary. I'd like to stay away from talking about threats if possible. We have communicated to the Bell/Munro staff to maintain awareness in the event of reprisals/etc, and I don't think we need to be more broad than that. The reporter brought up another common theme that has been emerging – trespassing at the site. Has there been a history of trespassing at the site? Have we interacted with the motocross community previously regarding trespassing? What steps have we taken to address our concerns?

We've had multiple news outlets ask these same, basic questions. I don't think we need to answer them at this time due to the ongoing investigation, itself, but we'll want to be ready to message on this front when the investigation wraps up. The storyline is not going away. I have reason to suspect that there are parties actively pushing a storyline that the community had long taken advantage of the federal land there for motocross and that it hadn't been such a big deal before Saturday.

Quick follow up. Got ahold of the Corporal and chatted for a bit. We're well connected and good to go moving forward. Warrants are typically filed with the court late on Friday afternoons. As Doug noted, after the warrants are served (Washington law requires within three days of being filed), the court will release those warrants publicly (also required by law) within a few business days.

What that means practically for us is that both InterCon and the security officer's name will likely be public next week. The security officer should be prepped with that awareness in order that they may prepare for media and public interest. In the unlikely event that media discloses PII beyond the name of the security officer, both the Corporal and I will work to squelch that additional info.

Sarah/Neil, Corporal Gregory had some recommendations for InterCon regarding media questions that they might receive. InterCon should be prepared to handle any employment questions, including things like administrative leave if applicable. All other questions, including policies, procedures, the right to engage or bear a weapon, etc., should be directed back to Corporal Gregory until such time as the official investigation is complete. This will buy InterCon time and hopefully allow some of the negative backlash from the shooting calm down some as more facts of the case become publicly known.

What the Corporal suggests in the interim is that InterCon simply state something along the lines of "We want a complete gathering of the facts surrounding this case. With the tragic loss of life, we know the community has a vested interest in understanding fully what occurred, and we, too, want a complete and thorough investigation. Once that's done, we'll conduct our own internal review of policies and procedures to ensure that they were properly followed."

We can likely leverage a similar statement/sentiment if needed in terms of our internal reviews if we get asked that question.

In the meantime, I'll keep an eye out on any new media that pops up and keep the group informed.

I had a brief chat with Corporal Gregory with the Spokane County Sheriff's Office earlier this afternoon. Corporal Gregory informed me that his office will be filing warrants with the court there related to the recent shooting. He says the warrants are likely to be unsealed, which means names, organizations, etc., will NOT be redacted. These warrants are likely to be made public by the court some time in the next 2 to 5 business days.

Reporters know this is likely to happen and will be monitoring publicly available court documents to track and report on the incident. There is a small chance a lazy reporter could post these documents in their entirety, which include more information (addresses, etc.) than should be shared publicly. Kevin is monitoring the media reports and will likely catch these quickly. If personal information is made available, we'll need to quickly contact the outlet that does it and have them pull down the info. Corporal Gregory thinks this is unlikely – but you never know.

Corporal Gregory is copied on this email. He says the best way to reach him is on his cell at 509-850-6499. He says if something needs his immediate attention, you should text him and let him know it is urgent. Kevin, please let Corporal Gregory know the best way to contact you if he needs to.

Sarah and Neil, you should probably give your contacts at the security firm know. Corporal Gregory, please correct any of the info I may have misinterpreted or provide any additional details my colleagues might need.

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Different reporter from The Spokesman-Review called and took another run at getting the name of the contract provider. Gave the same answer as I gave to her colleague earlier.

The reporter brought up another common theme that has been emerging – trespassing at the site. Has there been a history of trespassing at the site? Have we interacted with the motocross community previously regarding trespassing? What steps have we taken to address our concerns?

We've had multiple news outlets ask these same, basic questions. I don't think we need to answer them at this time due to the ongoing investigation, itself, but we'll want to be ready to message on this front when the investigation wraps up. The storyline is not going away. I have reason to suspect that there are parties actively pushing a storyline that the community had long taken advantage of the federal land there for motocross and that it hadn't been such a big deal before Saturday.

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Quick follow up. Got ahold of the Corporal and chatted for a bit. We're well connected and good to go moving forward. Warrants are typically filed with the court late on Friday afternoons. As Doug noted, after the warrants are served (Washington law requires within three days of being filed), the court will release those warrants publicly (also required by law) within a few business days.

What that means practically for us is that both InterCon and the security officer's name will likely be public next week. The security officer should be prepped with that awareness in order that they may prepare for media and public interest. In the unlikely event that media discloses PII beyond the name of the security officer, both the Corporal and I will work to squelch that additional info.

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We can likely leverage a similar statement/sentiment if needed in terms of our internal reviews if we get asked that question.

In the meantime, I'll keep an eye out on any new media that pops up and keep the group informed.

BPA is fully cooperating with the investigation led by the Spokane County Sheriff's Office. 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

Kevin and Dana,

We're currently pulling together records on security incidents over the past year associated with the Bell/Munro property, primarily trespass activity. Kevin Wingert reached out to me today to discuss some themes he's seeing emerge in media about trespassing on the Bell/Munro site. So, this information gathering is to help counter the media storyline that BPA allows people to be on our property, riding motorcycles, etc.

We know we have a history of trespassing, which we can collect information through our SIRS database. However, I told Kevin the greater story of the overall history of the property, to include the huge dumping mess and environmental clean-up efforts, unauthorized camping, criminal and drug activity, four-wheeling and off-road activity damaging the property, etc.

Looking to change the storyline of the property as the shooting case evolves, we wanted to see if you both could help put together a general timeline of what's been done across the property to mitigate the longstanding problems. Also, we're wanting to see if we can capture rough estimates on how much BPA has spent to clean-up the property and mitigate problems on the property. So, things like limbing up the trees, environmental clean-up, posting of signage, are all examples.

I'm hoping we can set up some time perhaps Thursday or Friday next week. I'll look at calendars and see what's feasible.

Based on initial analysis of the approximately 15,000 lines of Ocularis user action provided by JLS, Here are the initial results of who has viewed and/or exported the footage. My initial conclusion is only myself, Richard, and Matt viewed the record footage using Ocularis. Other NNT personnel (Kevin, Sarah, you) have viewed the downloaded version in the viewer. With regard to AMS, I'm highly confident that nearly every AMS provisioned user has seen the footage, either through their own access in Ocularis or second hand from being present in AMS.

The positive is that only three export windows have occurred. Two are AMS following procedure to export footage for immediate law enforcement purposes and incident report logging. The final was the 24 hour footage export I performed from the cameras to support record keeping.

I'm also highly confident that more views of the footage between 20231005-1444 (log end for this query) and when Aaron was able to create copied versions of cameras to deactivate browsing access of "old" footage have occurred. However, those who viewed are likely the same already logged below.

This chewed up the 2 hours I estimated this morning and haven't been able to compile all actions I have taken and parse e-mails supporting it. However, I will get it sorted next week.

It's still a little too early to determine if there's any issues with what happened. We're waiting for the active investigation to conclude, which leaves me in a position where I can't comment on what occurred, and we have not implemented an official "Lessons Learned" review yet.

In the interim, we have made some changes to the approach the security officers are taking with trespassing events at Bell and Munro. The changes are due to safety concern in case there's someone who might react and seek retribution for what occurred.

If you'd like to discuss more, please let me know and we can set up some time for a call. Again, information sharing about the incident is going to be very limited right now until the Spokane County Sheriff's Office has officially closed the investigation.

I'm including Sarah Laylo on the CC for awareness. She's back in the Chief Security Officer position for NN.

This special report is produced to cover media related to a shooting that occurred near a BPA facility in Spokane, Wash., on Sept. 30, and involved a member of BPA's contract security force.

This latest iteration of the story - the first in several weeks - appeared first in the Spokesman-Review yesterday afternoon and was subsequently picked up on wire and carried on Yahoo and in The Columbian.

The article is based on a lawsuit from the family against Inter-Con Security. It names the guard employed by Inter-Con. Media Relations was not contacted by the Spokesman-Review for the story. The story is focused on the family's narrative of the event and how that differs significantly from statements released by local law enforcement. Overall, despite inflammatory statements from the family via their lawyer or the lawsuit, the story, itself, is very balanced.

The investigation into this shooting is still ongoing. Given the continuing law enforcement activity and the corresponding litigation, BPA's response to any media inquiries will be limited in nature — acknowleding the event, the tragic loss of life, the ongoing investigation and our cooperation with law enforcement as well as an awareness of the lawsuit. We will refer media to the Spokane County Sheriff's Office for questions regarding the investigation or to Inter-Con Security for questions regarding the lawsuit.



FWIW, here is a copy of the complaint filed in state court against Inter-Con, based on the Bell substation shooting. The allegations paint a picture of many of the interactions before the shooting on public roads and non-BPA property. It is unclear now how accurate the allegations are. I have asked the DOE IG for a copy of the SCSO report when it comes out (if they can share it with us), and we hope to be able to see the video at some time in the near future.

So far, the allegations with regard to BPA are only that BPA hired Inter-Con. I still operate under the assumption that the United States will be sued eventually by the plaintiffs, or that Inter-Con will remove this to federal court and implead the United States. Maybe we will be lucky and that won't happen.

I would advise not circulating this complaint outside of OGC, as so many other sources of information have yet to be heard from, and this will only spark wild rumors. Of course, the complaint is a public document, and if motivated, others can obtain it too.

- 1.2 Erin Franklin is the personal representative of her deceased husband, John Franklin, by order of the court entered October 18, 2023.
- 1.3 Erin Franklin is acting on her own behalf as a plaintiff, and on behalf of the Plaintiff Estate of John Franklin, the latter of which includes her and John Franklin's adult sons, Brock and Blake Franklin, and minor daughter Avery Franklin.
- 1.4 Erin Franklin is entitled to bring this action for the wrongful death of her husband and her children's father for their, and for his, benefit.
- 1.5 John Franklin, now deceased, was a resident of Spokane County, Washington, and Erin Franklin's husband.
- 1.6 John Franklin died on September 30, 2023, at the age of 48, in Spokane County, Washington (D.O.B. March 7, 1975; and D.O.D. September 30, 2023).
- 1.7 John Franklin died by gunshot to the chest, inflicted by a private noncommissioned security guard employed by Defendant Inter-Con Security Services, Inc.
- 1.8 John Franklin died on September 30, 2023, at approximately 11:30 a.m., with the cause of his death deemed by the Spokane County Medical Examiner to be a homicide.
- 1.9 Plaintiff Brock Franklin is the adult son of Erin and John Franklin. He is over the age of 18 (D.O.B. September 29, 2004), and he was, and is, a resident of Spokane County, Washington.
- 1.10 Brock Franklin was also shot by Defendant Inter-Con's security guard, injured in his right forearm, wrist and hand, left abdomen/hip and left thigh, including incurring bone

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fractures and absorbing multiple shrapnel fragments, all of which will cause irreparable and potentially progressive damage, depending on outcome.

- 1.11 Defendant Inter-Con Security Services, Inc. (Inter-Con) transacts business in Spokane County, Washington, providing private security services within Spokane County.
- 1.12 Defendant Inter-Con Security Services, Inc also has a foreign profit corporation parent company, with its principal office in Pasadena, California.
- 1.13 Defendant Inter-Con Security Services's parent company is also registered in the State of Washington, and transacts business in Spokane County, Washington.
 - 1.14 Both defendants together are referred to as Defendant Inter-Con.
- Department of Energy to provide security for its Bonneville Power Administration (BPA) electric utility facility at its property located at 2410 East Hawthorne Road, Mead, Washington, 99021.
- 1.16 Defendant Inter-Con placed its employee security guard at BPA's East Hawthorne Road facility, and the identity of that security guard remains to be determined.
- 1.17 The events causing injury and death to John Franklin and injury to Brock Franklin occurred near the East Hawthorne Road address, because of Defendant Inter-Con's actions.
- 1.18 All relevant actions for purposes of this complaint occurred in Spokane County, Washington, and venue is proper in Spokane County, Washington.

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II. LIABILITY

- 2.1 Defendant Inter-Con Security Services, Inc. owed John Franklin and Brock Franklin a duty of care, and breached that duty, as explained herein, and Defendant Inter-Con Security Services, Inc. is liable for the actions of its security guard.
- 2.2 Defendant is vicariously liable for the actions of its agents and employees placed upon company properties when it provides private security guard services to those companies.
- 2.3 Defendant contracts with the Department of Energy to provide such services, and those contracts will identify the terms of the services provided, limits of authority, and protocols for such services.
- 2.4 Defendant's employee was acting within the scope of his employment for Defendant, including while using excessive force, for purposes of the facts detailed herein.
- 2.5 Defendant's security guard's actions causing Plaintiffs' injury and death occurred at or near the location at which Defendant placed that guard to perform his duties, with all actions engaged in by Defendant's security guard within the scope of, and pursuant to, the security guard's employment and instruction, and with all actions engaged in during the hours the security guard was on duty for Defendant.
- 2.6 Defendant's security guard's use of force was sufficiently foreseeable to Defendant to support its vicarious liability for those acts, because the normal duties for Defendant's employee contemplated the use of force, and were not unexpected to Defendant in view of the duties it assigned its employee.

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2.7 Defendant Inter-Con Security is directly liable for its own actions.

III. FACTS.

- 3.1 Investigation remains in progress; however, the essential facts are believed to be those identified in the following paragraphs.
- 3.2 The United States Department of Energy maintains the Bonneville Power Administration (BPA) facility, along with large tracts of vacant land adjacent to its facility, at 2410 East Hawthorne Road, Mead, Washington, 99021.
- 3.3 BPA's vacant land adjoins other various vacant land tracts owned by private and commercial landowners, creating a large vacant land area that spans from the northern border of East Hawthorne road (running east/west), extending south of East Hawthorne Road to the southern border of East Magnesium Road (running east/west), bordered on the west by North Nevada Street (running north-south), and bordered on the east by North Market Street (running north/south), with this land conglomeration referred to hereafter as the "Area."
- 3.4 The Area has recreational roads and trails throughout it, and has been used for years by off-road riders/drivers and by the public for recreational purposes.
- 3.5 A large parking area exists on the southeast portion of the land tracts where families park, socialize, unload motocross bikes and ATV/UTVs from their haulers and pickup trucks, teach their children to ride, and set out on the adjoining trails and roads.
- 3.6 Public and private landowners often allow public access and use of their land for purposes of outdoor recreation, including the use of off-road vehicles. See, e.g., RCW § 4.24,210.

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3.7 Recreational use of the Area was ongoing, has been known to all adjoining businesses and individuals owning that land, to the public, to the Department of Energy (whose transmission towers dot the land), to Defendant Inter-Con Security Services, Inc., and to Spokane County law enforcement.

- 3.8 The Franklin family are off-road motocross enthusiasts, and the family has long participated in recreational motocross.
- 3.9 John Franklin and his sons would ride together, often at the Airway Heights motocross park, but when that park was closed for events, they would sometimes ride at the Area. On September 30, 2023, the Airway Heights course was not available.
- 3.10 On the morning of Saturday, September 30, 2023, Brock Franklin (Brock) drove his truck to the Area to ride, accompanied by his father John Franklin (John). John's motocross motorcycle was not operational, and he accompanied his son for companionship.
 - 3.11 Brock's single motocross bike was in the truck bed.
- 3.12 Brock drove onto East Hawthorne Road, and, some distance from the BPA transformer facility, turned into a small publicly accessible gravel pull-out on the north side of East Hawthorne Road.
- 3.13 That gravel area pull-out area off Hawthorne Road is fully accessible to the public traveling on the road, available for people to make U-turns, etc., and the roads in that area are complicated due to ongoing freeway construction.

	3.14	On September 20, 2023, Brock and John Franklin found a newly irrstalled
BPA	"No Tres	spassing" sign in that gravel pullout. That sign has a value of less than \$750
total		

- 3.15 Brock's truck pushed over that sign in the gravel area, but the sign was not damaged, certainly not damaged to an extent in excess of \$750, nor was it rendered unusable. No diminution in the value of that property occurred as the consequence of the act, and there would have been little to no cost to repair any possible physical damage.
 - 3.16 No one else was present in the gravel area at the time this contact occurred.
- 3.17 Brock observed a vehicle with a light bar flashing coming towards him eastbound on East Hawthorne Road.
- 3.18 This vehicle was driven by a private security guard employed by Defendant Inter-Con.
- 3.19 Defendant's vehicle passed Brock's vehicle heading eastbound, made a Uturn on Hawthorne, and pulled in behind Brock's truck.
 - 3.20 Defendant's vehicle continued to have its lights activated.
 - 3.21 Brock recognized that this vehicle was not law enforcement.
- 3.22 Defendant's security guard is not commissioned as a law enforcement officer.
- 3.23 Defendant's security guard was on a public road, outside any "territorial jurisdiction" of any private security enforcement.
 - 3.24 No crime occurred in the private security guard's presence.

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- 3.25 Even if a misdemeanor had arguably occurred, the nature of that crime was not a breach of peace misdemeanor.
 - 3.26 No breach of the peace was ongoing.
- 3.27 Defendant's vehicle had sufficient time behind Brock's vehicle to note any license plate information for any investigative purposes, and to call for law enforcement assistance, or other security backup.
- 3.28 Defendant's guard did not call for such assistance, nor report the license plate number to law enforcement.
 - 3.29 Brock drove forward out of the gravel area onto East Hawthorne Road.
- 3.30 Brock observed, in his rearview mirror, Defendant's vehicle aggressively accelerating behind him, pursuing Brock onto East Hawthorne Road, then pursuing him westbound on East Hawthorne Road itself, and then closing the distance between the vehicles to a matter of several feet.
- 3.31 Defendant's security guard was again on a public road, outside his territorial jurisdiction.
- 3.32 Defendant's private security guard had no authority to pursue Brock outside his private property jurisdiction, nor did he have a right to pursue Brock as a citizen to make a citizen's arrest, because no misdemeanor crime had occurred in his presence, and even if a misdemeanor crime had occurred in his presence, the nature of that crime was not a breach of peace misdemeanor.

- 3.56 Brock told his father he would not leave him; his father again ordered him to the vehicle.
 - 3.57 Brock obeyed his father and returned to the driver's seat.
- 3.58 Defendant's security guard issued no orders, knew that Brock would obey his father, and knew that Brock's father was trying to defuse the situation, keep his son out of it, and return to his vehicle.
- 3.59 Defendant's security guard knew that Brock was concerned about his father, and that Brock was watching Defendant's security guard's physical attempt to subdue Brock's father.
 - 3.60 Defendant's security guard continued to escalate the situation.
- 3.61 John had been able to back up sufficiently to reach the passenger side door in an attempt to regain the passenger seat. Brock observed his father in the passenger side window, saw his father reach for the door handle, saw his father's body begin to turn to the door to open it, and heard the handle begin to move, when he saw the Defendant's security guard knock John to the ground.

leave his drive	r's seat again to attempt to protect his father from the assault. He came around
the front of the	e vehicle this time, as both the Defendant's security guard and his father were

- 3.63 Brock remained unarmed.
- 3.64 Brock approached the Defendant's security guard standing over and wrestling his father, and physically shoved the guard off his father.
 - 3.65 Brock used reasonable force to protect his father.
- 3.66 At no point did Defendant's security guard tell Brock Franklin what he was doing with his father, that he was trying to arrest his father, or to stand back.
- 3.67 Defendant's security guard now began to back up towards his vehicle and the guard reached towards his belt.
- 3.68 Brock believed he was about to be pepper sprayed, and began physically turning away from what he believed was going to be pepper spray diffusion.
- 3.69 Defendant's security guard had unholstered a semiautomatic handgun, not pepper spray.
- 3.70 As this was happening, Brock's father John got up off the ground and began moving between his son and Defendant's security guard.
- 3.71 Defendant's security guard fired four to five shots at both Brock and John, with the intent to kill.

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IV. CAUSES OF ACTION

Plaintiffs restate the foregoing facts, and claim as causes of action:

Wrongful death and survival claims.

- 4.1 This action is brought for all economic and non-economic damages sustained by John Franklin and his beneficiaries listed in RCW 4.20.020 as a result of his death, in such amounts as determined by a trier of fact to be just under all the circumstances of the case. RCW 4.20.010.
- 4.2 This action includes the survival claims of John Franklin, and for all economic and noneconomic damages sustained by the individual plaintiffs.
- 4.3 Defendant Inter-Con Security Services, Inc. and others to be determined, are liable for the wrongful death of John Franklin, caused by the wrongful actions of Defendant Inter-Con Security Services, Inc., through and by its security guard.
- 4.4 Defendant's wrongful actions include, but are not limited to, unlawful pursuit on a public road, assault and battery, excessive force, and intentional infliction of emotional distress, all of which are asserted both as a part of this wrongful death claim, and as independent causes of action.
- 4.5 The Defendant's negligent actions include, but are not limited to, Defendant's breach of its duties of care to Plaintiffs, which proximately caused resulting injury and death.
- 4.6 Private security officers are not federal or state law enforcement officers, they are not empowered by law to make arrests, searches, or seizures. See, e.g., Rabieh v.

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United States, 2019 WL 5788673, at *2 (N.D. Cal. Nov. 6, 2019) (addressing private security officers providing security screening at the Federal Building).

- 4.7 Defendant's duties of care referenced for this claim and as independent negligence claims of their own accord include negligence in ensuring the safety of Plaintiffs, and injuring both and killing one Plaintiff, including, but not limited to, the following:
- 4.7.1 Negligence in the training and/or supervision of its noncommissioned security guard for security work on and off this particular property, given its known use, and on the adjoining public roads;
- 4.7.2 Negligence in the training and/or supervision of its noncommissioned security guard for vehicle pursuit on public roads, traffic stops, and traffic stop apprehensions;
- 4.7.3 Negligence in the training of its security guard in engaging in a vehicle pursuit on a public road, and in escalation of that event to the unnecessary attempt to physically detain a cooperative passenger without calling for the assistance of law enforcement;
- 4.7.4 Negligence in failing to call for backup by additional security personnel to the scene of this vehicle pursuit and apprehension;
- 4.7.5 Negligence in the training of its security guard in directing such personnel to clearly issue instructions to whoever he was trying to detain, whether lawfully on unlawfully, to de-escalate any detention situation initiated by that security guard;

- 4.7.6 Negligence in the training of its security guard in de-escalation, and in the use of weapon selection, including the use of a semi-automatic weapon of any kind, during any intended traffic stop and detention on or near a public road;
- 4.7.7 Negligence in the training of its security guard to render medical aid to those against whom he used a weapon.
- B. Assault and battery/excessive force.
- 4.8 Defendant Inter-Con Security Services, Inc. and others to be determined, engaged in, and are liable for, assault and battery.
- 4.9 Defendant assaulted John and Brock Franklin by reckless pursuit on a public road, which endangered John and Brock and others on that roadway, and caused John and Brock to pull back onto BPA land.
- 4.10 Defendant assaulted John and Brock Franklin by the intentional touching of both of these individuals in a manner that was harmful or offensive.
- 4.11 Defendant's security guard's aggression provoked a physical retreat by John, and the Defendant security guard's continued pursuit and assault from which John was retreating evoked a reasonable physical defense by both John and Brock Franklin.
- 4.12 Defendant battered both John and Brock Franklin, intending to cause John and Brock apprehension of imminent contact and physical pain, and causing such contact and pain. ¹

4.13 Defendant's security guard's escalation of force was not reasonably necessary to either effect a detention or an arrest, nor was the degree of escalation reasonable or necessary to defend himself against an attack that he provoked.

4.14 To the extent that John and ultimately Brock Franklin resisted Defendant's assaults, both did so lawfully; each's use of force upon or toward Defendant was not unlawful under the circumstances they experienced from Defendant's security guard, when both were about to be, and were being, physically injured, and where both were lawfully aiding each other in preventing or attempting to prevent injury to their family member.

4.15 Each of John and Brock's uses of force were not more than was necessary to push the Defendant's security guard away, without causing him injury.

C. Intentional Infliction of Emotional Distress.

4.16 Defendant, through its security guard, engaged in extreme and outrageous conduct, and intentional or reckless infliction of emotional distress upon both Brock and John, in assaulting John, doing so in full view of his son Brock, and by showing John the intent to draw a weapon of some kind against his son Brock, and the actual result of such to both Plaintiffs was severe emotional distress, which remains with Brock, and which will be permanent.²

D. Loss of Consortium-spousal.

4.17 As a result of Defendant's actions, and as damage, Plaintiff Erin Franklin has lost the consortium of her husband, John Franklin.³

E. Loss of Consortium-parental.

4.18 As a result of Defendant's actions, Plaintiff Brock Franklin, Blake Franklin and Avery Franklin have lost the consortium of their father, John Franklin.

V. PROXIMATE CAUSE.

- 5.1 The Defendant's actions identified above unnecessarily caused substantial injury, pain, suffering pre-death, and death to John Franklin.
- 5.2 The Defendant's actions identified above unnecessarily caused substantial injury, pain, and suffering to Brock Franklin.
- 5.3 The Defendant's actions identified above unnecessarily caused loss of spousal consortium to John Franklin's wife, Erin Franklin, and loss of parental consortium to John Franklin's children, Brock, Blake, and Avery Franklin.

VI. DAMAGES.

WHEREFORE, the Plaintiffs reassert all of the above and state as follows:

6.1 As a direct and proximate result of the Defendant's actions detailed above, John Franklin suffered substantial fear for himself and for his son, anxiety, anguish, distress, and pain in the time leading up to his death.

- 6.2 As a direct and proximate result of the Defendant's actions detailed above, John Franklin died.
- 6.3 As a direct and proximate result of the Defendant's actions detailed above, Brock Franklin suffered substantial fear for himself and for his father, anxiety, anguish, distress, and pain in the time leading up to his death.
- 6.4 As a direct and proximate result of the Defendant's actions detailed above, Brock Franklin suffered physical injury, including injury that may be progressive and permanent.
- 6.5 As a direct and proximate result of the Defendant's wrongful acts, John Franklin's surviving spouse, Erin Franklin, has been deprived of her husband's marital consortium, including his past and continuing love, support, affection, care, companionship, nurturing, advice, guidance, counsel, and society.
- As a direct and proximate result of Defendant's wrongful acts, John Franklin's surviving children have been deprived of the services and consortium their father would have provided, his continuing love, support, affection, care, companionship, nurturing, advice, guidance, counsel, training, education, and society.

VII. RELIEF REQUESTED.

WHEREFORE, the Plaintiffs request:

- 7.1 That judgment be entered against the Defendants for compensation for all loss suffered by the Plaintiff Estate and beneficiaries, as well as by the Plaintiffs.
- 7.2 That judgment be entered for any and all further relief available as a matter of law at the time this matter is tried.

This special report is produced to cover media related to a shooting that occurred near a BPA facility in Spokane, Wash., on Sept. 30, and involved a member of BPA's contract security force.

This latest iteration of the story - the first in several weeks - appeared first in the Spokesman-Review yesterday afternoon and was subsequently picked up on wire and carried on Yahoo and in The Columbian.

The article is based on a lawsuit from the family against Inter-Con Security. It names the guard employed by Inter-Con. Media Relations was not contacted by the Spokesman-Review for the story. The story is focused on the family's narrative of the event and how that differs significantly from statements released by local law enforcement. Overall, despite inflammatory statements from the family via their lawyer or the lawsuit, the story, itself, is very balanced.

The investigation into this shooting is still ongoing. Given the continuing law enforcement activity and the corresponding litigation, BPA's response to any media inquiries will be limited in nature -- acknowleding the event, the tragic loss of life, the ongoing investigation and our cooperation with law enforcement as well as an awareness of the lawsuit. We will refer media to the Spokane County Sheriff's Office for questions regarding the investigation or to Inter-Con Security for questions regarding the lawsuit.



BPA Security forwarded your letter to me. BPA put a litigation hold into place shortly after the Bell substation shooting.

You also requested a copy of the video (and perhaps other BPA records surrounding the shooting). For that, Inter-Con has two options: a FOIA request or a <u>Touhy</u> request. A <u>Touhy</u> request is for instances involving a state or federal court or administrative proceeding in which the agency or the United States is not a party. The requirement for doing so under the Department of Energy regulations is at 10 CFR 212. Any such request by Inter-Con needs to be sent to me, which I forward to the DOE Office of General Counsel for approval. Only DOE OGC can approve the release of BPA records under these circumstances.

It is also likely that the United States Attorney's Office in Spokane will be asked for its opinion on any Touhy request.
