**Subject:** BPA Post-2011 Energy Efficiency Review Update #1 – Request for Public Comment and Interest in Workgroups

Dear Customer/Stakeholder,

The Post-2011 Review process officially commenced on November 22, 2013 at a public meeting in Portland, Oregon. BPA is seeking comment on the proposed scope and process that was discussed at the kick-off meeting and put into the draft scoping document. Comments should be submitted via the [BPA public comment website](#) by December 21, 2013.

BPA requests that utility customers and stakeholders use this public comment process to:

- Provide feedback on the issues within scope for the Review in the updated scoping document
- Express interest in participating in a workgroup or multiple workgroups
- Inform BPA of willingness to host regional meetings
- Sign up to receive future communication regarding the Post-2011 Review

BPA will issue a final scoping document later this month based on comments received. Workgroup meetings will then commence in January.

#### Background

The Post-2011 Energy Efficiency Review (“Post-2011 Review”) is a public process to review and consider improvements to the BPA energy efficiency policy framework and associated implementation elements put in place on October 1, 2011.

Prior to 2011, BPA’s Energy Efficiency’s group conducted a public process to engage customers and other regional stakeholders about the role they think BPA should play in developing, incentivizing and monitoring energy efficiency programs after 2011. The goal for that public process was to gain feedback and support from the region on the structure of energy efficiency programs that BPA was planning to offer post-2011. Prior to the 2011 fiscal year beginning, BPA adopted a Post-2011 energy efficiency program strategy and policy for the agency through a public process. During the process, BPA and stakeholders agreed to review and consider improvements to the BPA energy efficiency policy framework after sufficient experience (one rate period) had been gained.
