**PETITION TO INTERVENE OF
PUBLIC POWER COUNCIL**

Pursuant to Rule 1010.4(b) of the Bonneville Power Administration (BPA) Rules of Procedure Governing Rate Hearings and the Federal Register Notice dated November 8, 2012 (77 Fed. Reg. 217), the Public Power Council (PPC) hereby petitions for leave to intervene as a party in the above-captioned proceeding in which BPA seeks to establish power and transmission rates for fiscal years 2014 and 2015. PPC presents the following facts in support of this petition.

PPC is a non-profit trade organization that represents the common interests of approximately 100 consumer-owned electric utilities in the Northwest that are preference customers of BPA. PPC's members purchase power and transmission from BPA at the rates set by BPA in its rate proceedings. PPC, therefore, has a direct and substantial interest in participating in this proceeding.
