Northwest Requirements Utilities (NRU) will not contest the settlement proposal.

However, notwithstanding the above, and pursuant to the terms of the draft settlement agreement, if any other party to BP-22 or TC-22 objects to or otherwise opposes the settlement proposal, then NRU will withdraw its assent to the settlement proposal and will retain rights to conduct cross-examination, submit data requests, testimony, and briefs in BP-22 and TC-22 with respect to any issue within the scope of the settlement proposal. NRU further reserves all of its rights under Bonneville's enabling statutes, the Federal Power Act and other applicable law.

Subject Description:

BPA's October 29 Tech Forum notice closing out the TC-22, BP-22, and EIM Phase III workshops informed customers that BPA had been contacted about the potential for settlement of transmission losses issues in the upcoming BP-22 and TC-22 proceedings and that BPA would be sharing a settlement proposal. A document with the terms of BPA's settlement proposal has now been posted to the [Meetings and Workshops page](#). The document provides a comparison of the terms of the settlement proposal to BPA's initial proposal in BP-22 and TC-22 in the absence of settlement.

A proposed settlement agreement will be distributed on Monday November 2, and a conference call and WebEx has been scheduled for Wednesday, November 4. Details for the conference call are provided below.

In order to have time to determine how to proceed with the initial proposal for BP-22 and TC-22, BPA is requesting that customers inform us of their position on the proposed settlement no later than Friday, November 13. Specifically, BPA requests that customers indicate whether they will support, oppose, or not contest the proposed settlement by submitting their response with the subject: "Transmission Loss Settlement Response" to techforum@bpa.gov and copy to their Transmission Account Executive.
