**Petition to Intervene of Avista
Corporation**

Pursuant to the notice posted in the Federal Register on November 8, 2012, regarding the Bonneville Power Administration (“BPA”) Fiscal Year (FY) 2014 Oversupply Rates Public Hearing and Opportunities for Public Review and Comment, 77 Fed. Reg. 66963 (2012) (“November 8 Notice”), and section 1010.4 of the Rules of Procedure Governing Bonneville Power Administration Rate Hearings, 51 Fed. Reg. 7611 (1986), Avista Corporation (“Avista”) hereby files this Petition to Intervene as a party in these proceedings. Avista requests that it be granted party status in BPA Docket No. OS-14, including any subdockets to that proceeding.

I. Petition to Intervene

BPA is holding a proceeding, Docket No. OS-14, to establish a rate to recover the costs incurred under the Oversupply Management Protocol, filed by BPA, with the Federal Energy Regulatory Commission (“FERC”) in FERC Docket No. EL11-44, as an amendment to BPA’s Open Access Transmission Tariff. Avista is a corporation created and organized under the laws of the State of Washington with its principal office in Spokane, Washington. Avista is an investor-owned utility engaged in among other things, the business of generating, transmitting, and distributing electric power to wholesale and retail customers in Idaho and Washington. Avista can contract directly with BPA for the purchase of power under sections 5(b) or 5(c) of the Northwest Power Act.

Avista is also a transmission customer of BPA. Avista has intervened in, and is a party to, FERC Docket No. EL11-44. Accordingly, Avista has an interest in these proceedings and is eligible to be a party in this proceeding. *See* 77 FED. Reg. at 66970. Avista's interests will not be represented adequately by any other party. Avista respectfully requests that it be allowed to intervene as a party in the above-captioned proceeding.

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
