Proposed Action: Ross-Lexington No. 1 Span 2/2, 5/3, and 19/4 Impairment Remedy

Categorical Exclusion Applied (from Subpart D, 10 C.F.R. Part 1021): B1.3 Routine Maintenance

Description of the Proposed Action: The Bonneville Power Administration (BPA) is proposing to remedy three impairments along the Ross-Lexington No. 1 corridor ahead on line from structures 2/2, 5/3, and 19/4. Impairments occur when the distance between a surface and the overhead conductor is not sufficient to meet safety and reliability standards.

BPA is proposing to repair two impairments along the Ross-Lexington No. 1 corridor by excavating earth to mitigate these impairments ahead on line at structure 2/2 and 5/3. The site would be accessed using existing access roads. These would be excavated using dozers and excavators.

BPA is proposing to remedy the impairment ahead on line from 19/4 by installing a two-wood pole prop structure. The wood poles would be installed using an auger truck and disturbance would be minimal.

Findings: In accordance with Section 1021.410(b) of the Department of Energy's (DOE) National Environmental Policy Act (NEPA) Regulations (57 FR 15144, Apr. 24, 1992, as amended at 61 FR 36221-36243, July 9, 1996; 61 FR 64608, Dec. 6, 1996, 76 FR 63764, Nov. 14, 2011), BPA has determined that the proposed action:

- (1) fits within a class of actions listed in Appendix B of 10 CFR 1021, Subpart D see attached Environmental Checklist);
- (2) does not present any extraordinary circumstances that may affect the significance of the environmental effects of the proposal; and
- (3) has not been segmented to meet the definition of a categorical exclusion.

Based on these determinations, BPA finds that the proposed action is categorically excluded from further NEPA review.

WA DAHP concurred with BPA's No Adverse Effect determination for all Ross-Lexington No. 1 impairment project locations listed in this CX.</p> <p>Crews and equipment are to use existing access roads to and from each work site. Any access road maintenance performed will be limited to the existing road prism.</p> <p>In the event that archaeological or historical materials are discovered during project activities, work in the immediate vicinity must stop, the area secured and the DAHP and the environmental project lead will be notified.</p>

Explanation: Construction noise will be temporary and localized.

12. Human Health and Safety

Explanation: Proposed action is on existing right-of-way and access roads and will not impact human health or safety.

The proposed project would also meet conditions that are integral elements of the categorical exclusion. The project would not:

- Threaten a violation of applicable statutory, regulatory, or permit requirements for environment, safety, and health, or similar requirements of DOE or Executive Orders.
