Dear Landowner/interested party:

The Bonneville Power Administration (BPA) intends to fund the purchase of approximately 100 acres of wetland habitat, located between Multnomah Channel and Crane Slough on Sauvie Island in Columbia County, Oregon. When the purchase is complete, the Oregon Department of Fish and Wildlife (ODFW) will own and manage the property for fish and wildlife conservation purposes and BPA will receive a conservation easement to ensure that the habitat values on the property are always protected. BPA is sending this letter to inform nearby residents and other interested parties of this land purchase.

The funding will be provided as part of BPA's ongoing efforts to protect, restore and enhance habitat for Chinook (*Oncorhynchus tshawytscha*) and coho salmon (*Oncorhynchus kisutch*) and steelhead (*Oncorhynchus mykiss*). The funding partially fulfills commitments made in the 2010 "Willamette River Basin Memorandum of Agreement Regarding Wildlife Habitat Protection and Enhancement between the State of Oregon and the Bonneville Power Administration", part of ongoing efforts to mitigate for the impacts to fish and wildlife from the construction and operation of federal flood control and hydroelectric facilities in the Willamette River Basin.

Enclosed you will find a map detailing this land transaction. BPA has prepared a memo and environmental checklist documenting that no further environmental review of this funding action is required under the National Environmental Policy Act (NEPA). This documentation, known as a categorical exclusion, was approved on May 30, 2013 and is posted on BPA's website at: http://www.efw.bpa.gov/environmental_services/categorialexclusions.aspx.

ODFW will provide long-term stewardship for the land and will develop a management plan to guide the protection and enhancement of habitat on the property. ODFW will provide the opportunity for the public to review and comment on the draft plan. BPA will review the plan and must approve it before it is implemented. Management actions may include weed control and enhancement of native habitats. If BPA proposes to fund any of these activities, we will conduct additional environmental review under NEPA and other statutes as appropriate.




Vicinity Map
