In a phone conversation on January 10, 2013, Ms. Winn explained that the scope of the request and the entities listed adds to the a complexity of the request, in that outside entities will need to review documents with information that belongs to them. You declined narrowing the scope of your request to facilitate a more timely response.

We have reviewed your request and have determined that it addresses all of the criteria of a proper request under the FOIA, DOE, and BPA regulation that implements the FOIA at Title 10, Code of Federal Regulations, Part 1004.

Your request for a fee waiver is granted.

Although the statute allows BPA twenty (20) working days to respond to your request, as explained, the complexity could add to that time considerably. The initial due date for a response to you is Thursday, February 7, 2013.

We will proceed as quickly as we are able and provide you with partial releases as items are gathered and reviews are complete.
