We are still preparing the remaining responsive documents for commercial stakeholders to review. We anticipate having the documents ready to go out for their review by May 30, 2013. The stakeholders will have 10 working days to send us their objections to release, after which the BPA FOIA attorney will analyze their objections and we will make a final determination on release.

If BPA concludes that the objections do not meet the requirements for withholding under the FOIA, and that the documents should be released, then the stakeholder will have 7 days upon notification of the determination to respond. Depending on their response then we will release or be compelled by law to not release until the court decides on the correct application of the FOIA.

Documents that concern other agencies, i.e., Washington State Department of Natural Resources, will have the opportunity to review their documents and determine which are appropriate for release as well.
