We have received your request for records under the Freedom of Information Act (5 U.S.C. § 552). Thank you for your interest in the Bonneville Power Administration (BPA). Your request was received in this office on Thursday, April 24, 2014, and has been assigned control number BPA-2014-00967-F. Please use this number in any correspondence with the agency about your request.

You requested:

“GPO data for all available monitoring stations on the following dates at the shortest cadence available, i.e. the cadence at which the data was originally recorded and stored, (This may be 5 second cadence, 60 second cadence, etcetera, but we respectfully request the shortest cadence available):

1. July 15, 2000
2. October 29-31, 2003
3. January 21, 2005

We ask that this information be provided in electronic format, which also should be the format in which this information is stored.”
