Dear Mr. Lewis:

This is a final response to your request for records under the Freedom of Information Act (5 U.S.C. § 552).

#### **You requested:**

The hourly average MID-Columbia Day Ahead Market Clearing Price, for the ten year period beginning on January 1, 2004, and ending on December 31, 2013.

#### **Response:**

Using the subscription data from Dow Jones (*now Platts*), the average Mid-Columbia day ahead clearing price for the ten year period beginning on January 1, 2004, and ending on December 31, 2014, was calculated to be **\$39.81/MWh**. This price was derived using peak and off-peak day ahead power prices, and is considered to be flat (*or around the clock*).

This figure was derived from a database report; there are no responsive "documents."

There are no fees associated with this request.
