The Bonneville Power Administration (BPA) has received your request for agency records made under the Freedom of Information Act, 5 U.S.C. § 552 (FOIA). It was received on January 4, 2017 and has been assigned a Department of Energy (DOE) tracking number of BPA-2017-00378-F. Acknowledgement

BPA has reviewed your request and determined that it fulfills all criteria of a proper request under the FOIA and the DOE FOIA regulations at Title 10, Code of Federal Regulations, Part 1004.

FOIA Fee

You agreed to pay up to \$50.00 in fees.

Complex Requests

The FOIA requires that BPA act on requests “promptly” and that the agency make a determination on your request and respond within 20 working days (5 U.S.C. § 552(a)(6)). However, BPA has instituted multi-track processing as permitted by the FOIA (5 U.S.C. § 552(a)(6)(D)(i)). In accord with this process, simple requests and complex requests are placed in two different queues and each queue is processed on its own first-in-first-out basis. Requests are placed in the complex queue if they require significant agency time or resources to process. BPA has determined that a response to your request will likely require a search encompassing a large number of agency personnel and a review of the responsive records for statutory exemptions, and has therefore designated your request as complex.

Unusual/Exceptional Circumstances

The FOIA provides that an agency may extend the response time if “unusual circumstances” exist (5 U.S.C. § 552(a)(6)(B)(i)). Unusual circumstances include a need to search records located in field facilities, requests for a voluminous amount of records, and requests that require consultation with other agency components. BPA has determined that a response to your request may require consultation with other agency components and has therefore determined that your request involves unusual circumstances.

Target Date for Completion

In light of the above conditions and determinations, BPA currently estimates completion of a response to your request by May 5, 2017.
